My Lord,—I have the honor to enclose an humble Address to the Queen from the House of Assembly, which I have been requested to forward to Your Lordship to be presented to Her Majesty. Your Lordship is aware of my opinion, that the composition of the Legislative Council has not given to that Body all the weight which it is desirable it should possess.

In the course of the Session, a Bill was passed by the Assembly to establish a property qualification

for the Members of the Legislative Council, by whom the Bill was rejected.

A Return of the Legislative Councillors, will be found at page 66, of the Blue Book for 1842, specifying the dates of their appointments, and the offices which are held by those who exercise other functions.
