C. A. FOX OPTICIAN Walkerton Palmerston Burglars Must Stand Trial.

Provincial Detective Elliott last Thursday morning returned to Guelph with a prisoner from Palmerston, Edward Hayes, who was placed under arrest in connection with a burglary at Anderson's harness shop, Pa'mersten, on Sunday morning. High County Constable Green and Detective Elliott had been working on the theft since Monday and made three arrests. Avril Mitchell, a pal of Hayes, and Rolson Driver, a farmer, who resides in Maryborough Township, were the other two taken into custody. Mitchell faces a charge of theft along with Hayes, while Driver is charged with receiving stolen goods. The three men appeared before Magistrate Rabb at Palmerston on Wednesday of last week and were committed for trial. Driver and Mitchell were allowed out on bail of \$2,000 each. Some of the stolen goods, it is alleged, were located at Driver's farm, while the remaining articles were found in a swamp just outside of Palmerston.


