President Garfield Assassinated

TWO BULLETS LODGED IN HIS DODY

ARREST OF THE ASSASSIN. Intense Excitement over the Event. HIS LIFE HANGING BY A THREAD.

Washington, July 2.—Probably no event in the history of the United States of America, since the murder of President Lincoln, sixteen years ago, has so shocked, not alone American people, but, judging from the tone of the thousands of telegraphic despatches which pour into this city, the people of the whole civilized world, than the cruel and wanton, and as present indications show successful, attempted assassination of President Garbield. When the rumour was first circulated that such an unexpected deed had been done, it was received with general incredulity; but, soon the truth was forthcoming, and grief was expressed by every political opponent as well as every political friend. A rush was made for the newspaper offices, where every scrap of information placed upon the bulletin boards was eagerly read; the railway depots on was another centre of interest for the excited people. At the railway depots so intense became the excitement all business was almost suspended, stores in the city were closed, and merchants found but few customers. Up to a late hour this e-ining throngs of people sorrounded the Executive Monsion where the President lies dying.

GARFIELD'S MOVEMENTS.

President Garfield has for nearly a fortnight past been with his family taking a
little recreation at Long Branch by the
seaside. Of his doings there, and
his chance meeting with General Grant,
the public have been informed. A few
days since the discharge of executive
duties compelled his attendance at the
capital. This morning he intended to
return to his wife and family at Long
Branch. For that purpose he entered
the depot of the Baltimore and Potomac
Railway, arm in arm with Hon. Mr.
Blaine, Secretary of State. The two

ASSASSINATION OF THE PRESIDENT.

A man approached the President and fired several shots, two of which took effect. One lodged in the right arm and the other penetrated, the abdomen above the right hip, and lodged in the lowels. Mr. Secretary Blaine, on hearing the shots fired, rushed after the assassin to arrest him, but appeared to change his mind, and returned to the President, whom he found prostrated. The shooting occurred in the presence of sixty ladies, whose screams of horor at seeing such a dastardly crime perpetrated in their presence, did as much to slarm those in the vicinity as the sound of the pistol shots.
