Sarnia Crew, Lost Sight of In a Storm, Is Missing.

Detroit, Dec. 8.—Grave fears are entertained regarding the steamer Lake Michigan and the wooden steamer Sidney C. McLouth.
The Lake Michigan, with a crew of 12, mostly from Sarnia, Out., has not been reported since she cast away the barge Wawanosh, in Thursday's storm, the barge being wrecked later near Oscoda.
