

Notice is given that a light-house has been erected by the Government of Canada on Cape Despair, Bay of Chaleur, County of Gaspé, 14 miles. A light will be shown on the 1st September next.

Wm. Smith, Deputy Minister of Marine and Fisheries, returned to St. John's yesterday, having been on a tour of inspection of ports, light-houses, and fog-whistles on the Lower St. Lawrence and coasts of New Brunswick and Nova Scotia. He also visited St. John's, Newfoundland. Mr. Smith says the inshore codfisheries are this year very good, and affairs in the island generally prosperous. In conversation with leading Newfoundlanders, Mr. Smith says he found no desire for Confederation.

The leaders of the old confederate party still hold their views, but say that without an agreement on the part of the Dominion to construct a railroad across the Island Confederation would not be carried, and they believe that although the British Government would be pleased to see Confederation, still they will not bring any pressure.

The Governor, Col. Sir Stephen Hill and lady, are expected to visit Canada about the beginning of next month. Admiral Wessley, of flagship *Belcheroph*, intends sailing to Sydney, Cape Breton, and will then proceed to Quebec, where the ship will remain about three weeks.
