Athletic Games in New York.

New York, Oct. 5.—New York's indoor athletic season was ushered in last night with the beginning of the annual indoor track and field championships meeting of the Amateur Union. The performances of the winners in several events approached close to the records. The closest fight of the night was in the two-mile run, which was won by M. Driscoll, of Yonkers, a fraction of a second faster than George Bonha's performance, in 8:30.15. Driscoll had to fight all the way with Sullivan, the Irish-American star; H. A. Wilson, formerly of England, and G. A. Dull, of Michigan, who were the colors of the Pittsburgh Athletic Association.

Henry Glasing, of the New York Athletic Club, took the 1,000 yards run in 2:14.4.5, after a thrilling finish with Bromberg, of the Irish Americans. Glasing's time was 1.2.5 seconds faster than that which won him the same race last year. Lungli, the Italian runner, of whom great things were expected, finished sixth in this event. This was explained, however, by the fact that it was his first attempt of running on a board track. Melvin W. Sheppard did not run, reserving his strength for the 600 yards race to-morrow. Coe, of Boston, and Frank of Brown University, defeated Martin Sheridan in the 400-yard shot put. The figures, however, were four feet or so behind Ralph Rose's record of 47 feet 7 inches. Babcock, of the N. Y. A. C., won the pole vault for distance, with 27 feet 10 inches, after a tedious contest with Martin Sheridan, who was not in record-breaking form. At the end of tonight's twelve events the I. A. A. C. led with 41 points and the N. Y. C. A. C. with 23.

BACK TO THREE R'S.

Superintendent of Chicago Schools Announces It As Her Policy.

Mrs. Ella Flagg Young, who has been elected superintendent of the public schools of Chicago, announces that one main plank in her policy is to get the children back to the three R's: reading, writing and arithmetic. It is a cheerful note which she sounds, and we trust that she will bring forth such works as will lead other pedagogical sinners to repentance. Chicago took an unusual step in electing a woman to the important position, but she was by all odds the best equipped candidate and her policy was so much in accord with common sense and better experience that she won without much opposition.

Mrs. Young will have opportunity to put many of her plans into execution, for Chicago is preparing to make the educational world sit up and take notice. It is building a large number of children's clubhouses by day and people's clubhouses by night which will be of great value if the fond hopes of promoters are carried out. The idea is to make the schoolhouse the farthest removed from a jail. At present the difference is in favor of the jail. The new buildings are to be fitted up to teach all of the children manual training in more than kindergarten fashion. There will be manual work for all the boys and sewing and cooking for all the girls as part of the daily curriculum. There will be bathing pools and gymnasiums and lecture-rooms with moving pictures, described in lectures. There will be a lot of things which do not now exist and a lot of things which are now considered essential will be swept away.

Mrs. Young is determined that every child shall know how to read, write and spell with the greatest facility. These tools of the human mind will be complete without them. For the practical affairs and not a lot of book knowledge will be put in the fore. The idea is at last to turn out children who have some actual knowledge of the things which they are going to do and with an equipment sufficient to lead them to better things. What the ordinary words of three syllables; that they know a lot of physiology and can't write a decent letter; that they can parse every word in Evangelist; but can't add up a row of figures—Chicago Correspondent Philadelphia Inquirer.

Dr. McBrien Denies He Operated on Susie Clark.
(Special Despatch to the Times.)
St. Catharines, Ont., Oct. 5.—In an interview granted at Niagara Falls, N. Y., Dr. McBrien, of that city, who, according to the evidence given by Harry Willford and his wife at the inquest held last Friday night into the circumstances attending the death of Susie Clark, of Napanee, at the city hospital, performing the illegal operation which caused her death, denies positively any knowledge of the affair. He says he neither saw the girl nor performed any such operation.

Reduces Railroad Fire.
The Kansas City Railroad, which passes through the National Forest of the United States Forest Service, has undertaken an interesting piece of work with the view of reducing the number of fires in the district. The entire right of way of the railroad will be cleared of all inflammable material for a distance of 50 feet on each side of the tracks and where advisable the land will be burned off for an additional distance of 100 feet. The work will be supervised by the officials of the Forest Service. After the work of clearing has been completed the cleared land will remain under government supervision and employees of the service will be stationed along the length of the line through the reservation. A telephone plant will be installed for the exclusive use of the Forest Department.

No reason was given, but some of the butchers say the demand for pork is very small, and they think that is responsible for the falling off in price. Good beef is scarce and the price remains firm. There was a fair stock of produce on the fruit market, but the prices remained unchanged. Some choice late Crawford were in and were offered for 75 cents a basket. Grapes were plentiful and the price remained low. Dairy produce was firm at the same prices. There was some flurry on the hide market when a dealer raised the price of No. 2 hides to 15 cents.
