PROHIBITION NOT A FAILURE

Major Roy A. Haynes, Federal Prohibition Commissioner, in an address before the Law Enforcement League of Chicago on the 7th inst, is reported to have declared Prohibition is not a failure. Liquor propagandists assert the Prohibition law is being violated and therefore is a failure. There is not a law on any statute book anywhere that is not violated. If the liquor logic is valid, all of these laws are failures. Some Papers Are Due Last of This Month.

A considerable number of returns of all classes have been filed with the inspector of federal taxation, N. P. McLeod, but owing to the fact that there is some misunderstanding about the dates on which the period for filing expires, it is again pointed out that the returns of employers, estates and for dividends must be filed not later than March 31. Furpaid in the year.
