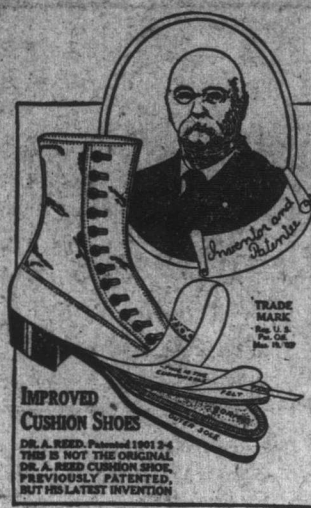

Ancient Enemies  
Resume Warfare.

Lloyd George Lunches With Bolsheviks--  
Trio of Irish Leaders Meet in Conference  
--Sugar Prices Taking the Down Grade  
--Other Royal Betrothals Expected.

**HOSTILITIES RESUMED.**  
ATHENS, April 14.  
Assumption of hostilities on a large  
scale between the Greeks and Turk-  
Nationalists in Asia Minor is re-  
ported. The Turks attacked on the  
Kastellor front but were re-  
pulsed with considerable loss.

**BRING GUARANTEES FROM RUSSIA.**  
GENOA, April 14.  
The Economic Conference commu-  
nized late to-night stated that  
representatives of the British, French,  
Belgian and Italian delegates had held  
informal meeting to consider the  
Russian delegates the consequen-

of finding out what guaran-  
tees Russia was prepared to give for  
presumption of economic relations.

**PROMISE MAY BE ARRANGED.**  
GENOA, April 14.  
The Bolshevik delegates and re-  
presentatives of France took luncheon  
with Lloyd George today, and from  
it is argued that a compromise  
will be arranged on the Russian prob-

lem which will afford a basis for the  
restoration of Russia. The key-  
note of the Allied position today was  
Russia must satisfy past pledges  
and containing any concessions for  
future. In other words, Russia  
must recognize the debts of the Czar  
Government before the Soviet Gov-  
ernment can be admitted. The Soviet  
delegation to the conference today  
circulated a statement that Rus-

sia meet many of the criticisms  
affecting foreigners in Rus-

sia, which meet many of the criticisms  
of the London experts' report, and in-  
timating that Russia was willing to  
acknowledge the pre-war debts, and  
erase the Soviet claims against the  
Allies arising from the operations of  
Wrangel, Denikin, and Yudenitch, if  
the Allied war claims against Russia  
are wiped out.

**THE STRIKERS' CLAIMS.**  
INDIANAPOLIS, April 14.  
The Miners' Union claim 665,000  
miners are now on strike, 35,000 non-  
union men having joined the strikers  
during the second week.

**SO FAR SO GOOD.**  
DUBLIN, April 13.  
Collins, Griffith, and DeValera met  
here today in the conference called by  
Mayor O'Neill in an endeavour to  
bring about peace. No agreement was  
reached and an adjournment was made  
made till Wednesday next, but the  
gathering issued a statement, saying  
it was the earnest wish of the parties  
that there should be no interference  
with public meetings.

**SUGAR PRICES.**  
VANCOUVER, April 13.  
With a drop of twenty cents today  
the wholesale price of sugar has  
dropped fifty cents this week to 35.50 per  
hundred pounds.

**REPUBLICANS ACTIVE IN DUBLIN.**  
BELFAST, April 14.  
Under direction of the newly formed  
Republican Army Council 250 in-  
surgents seized at midnight, four  
Courts building, which was the seat  
of the National Court of Justice, ac-  
cording to dispatches received here.  
The insurgents intend to use the build-  
ing as headquarters. It is stated, A  
large body of Sinn Feiners took pos-  
session of the Post Office at Sligo in  
the name of the Irish Republican  
Army. A strong party of Free Staters  
took possession of the County Court  
at Sligo.

**PROVISIONAL GOVERNMENT  
TAKES PRECAUTIONS.**  
DUBLIN, April 14.  
The Provisional Government has in-  
creased greatly the number of armed  
guards at the seat of administration.  
The College of Science and other  
places open to attack have also been

reinforced. Apprehension has been  
caused by the action of Anti-Treaty  
men in seizing the Four Courts build-  
ing and a hotel nearby. The buildings  
were seized and fortified in Easter  
Week, 1916. The leaders of the raid-  
ers declared, however, that there  
would be no revolution, the building  
being only wanted as headquarters.

**PRINCES' BETHORAL.**  
TORONTO, April 13.  
A London cable to the Mail and Em-  
pire says soon after the return of the  
Prince of Wales from his visits to  
India and Japan, his bethoral to Lady  
Mary Cambridge will be officially an-  
nounced, according to reliable infor-  
mation. About the same time, the an-  
nouncement will be made of the en-  
gagement of the Duke of York to Lady  
Rachel Gwendith.

**ENGINEER ALSO KILLED.**  
LONDON, April 13.  
Lieut. Bennett, engineer, who was  
planning to accompany Sir Ross Smith  
and his brother, was also killed, when  
the machine, which was intended for  
the world trip west into a spasm as it  
was approaching the airfield and  
crashed.

**WEATHER CONDITIONS PREVENT  
FLIGHT.**  
ST. VINCENT, CAPEVERDE IS-  
LAND, April 14.—Weather conditions  
again prevented the Portuguese avi-  
ators leaving on the last leg of the  
flight to Brazil to-day.

**SPANISH POSITION ATTACKED.**  
TETUAN, MOROCCO, April 14.  
An assault on the Spanish positions  
at Miskrelia was repulsed by the gar-  
rison, says an official communique.  
An artillery duel is in progress be-  
tween Spaniards and Moroccans at Va-  
lez Gomera.

**CURFEW HOUR CHANGED.**  
BELFAST, April 14.  
Owing to disorders last night and  
early today, the curfew hour has been  
changed from 6 to 6 a.m.

**FULLER SUCCEEDS DOOLEY.**  
LONDON, April 13.  
Hon. James Dooley, Premier of New

South Wales, resigned the Premier-  
ship to-day. Sir George Fuller, the  
successor of Dooley, is a well-known  
Labor Leader.

**FARMERS' OBJECTIVES.**  
WASHINGTON, April 13.  
Legislation providing for long term  
credits for the farmers, reduction of  
railway rates, adequate tariff protec-  
tion for agricultural products, and de-  
velopment of mussel shoals, and  
other fertilizer projects, were an-  
nounced today by Senator Gapper, Re-  
publican, as objectives of the Agricul-  
tural bloc.
