School Savings Banks.

Waldon Fawcett describes in the September St. Nicholas the success of a savings-bank experiment tried by a Washings-bank experiment tried by a washington, D. C., public school, a success which is likely to set other schools experimenting along the same lines. This school savings-bank is conducted in every way like a real bank. The principal makes himself responsible for the safe-keeping of the funds, and at the close of makes himself responsible for the safe-keeping of the funds, and at the close of each day's business deposits the daily receipts in one of the city's ordinary commercial banking institutions. Pupils are tellers and bookkeepers, doing all the work involved; and the children's pennies foot up already to the respectable fund of two hundred dollars.

## Man Killed by a Turkey.
