### TEACH AGRICULTURE IN PUBLIC SCHOOLS

[Special to The Advertiser.]  
Chatham, Feb. 6.—The sixth annual exhibition of the Ontario Corn Growers' Association closed its doors tonight at 8 o'clock. Officials and members are declaring tonight that it was the most successful of any exhibitions yet held by the association.

In the final lecture of the meeting, which was given this afternoon, Professor McCready, of Guelph, made a particularly strong appeal for the teaching of agriculture in the schools.

He showed that the department of education had been doing a great deal along this line, but said that the thing to do now was to arouse the interest of the people in the question and have them make a demand on the department for a more comprehensive course. He said that the western countries were making more headway in the matter than were any other countries in the province, and he complimented the people of Essex and Kent and adjoining counties for their activity in the matter.

He told at some length of the plans followed to give teachers the kind of training that will fit them to teach agriculture in the schools. He also advocated consolidated schools, and gave illustra-

License Inspector Claims He Was Attending to His Duties.

Hanna, speaking to The Advertiser today, said: "Mr. Snider was in Welland before the date of the election, as he himself says, but without instructions from myself or the department. Mr. Snider explained to me that this occurred in the regular performance of his duties, which kept him moving constantly throughout the province."

With regard to Huron, it is assumed that the same explanation will be given. A. H. Musgrove, M. P. for North Huron, is one who can speak of Mr. Snider's presence in the county during the campaign, and resented it vigorously.

### TEAM AND DRIVER WENT THROUGH ICE LITTLE GIRL DEAD FATHER BADLY INJURED

Teeswater Man Had Close Call From Being Drowned—\$300 Horse Dead.

Teeswater, Feb. 6.—The announcement of the death of a little girl and the injury to her father, who were caught in the ice on the Maitland River late Friday afternoon and had the closest kind of a call from being drowned.

Only the timely assistance of a number of icecutters saved Mr. Forster's life. One of his horses valued at \$300, died a few minutes after it had been gotten out, from the effects of the immersion in the icy water.

### DR. PRESTON FOR CABINET

Eastern Ontario Member To Be Minister Without Portfolio.
