

BISHOP LEMMENS HOME.

Some of the incidents of his ten months' trip to Europe.

His Visit to Rome and Private Audience With the Pope.

When the Premier lifted up at the C.P.N. wharf last evening quite a number of the congregation of St. Andrew's church were on hand to welcome home to Victoria Bishop Lemmens, who for the past ten months had been absent in Europe and the Eastern part of this continent. Rev. Fathers Van Nessel and Nicolay were also present to meet their Bishop, and after hearty handshaking and congratulations on his safe return the Bishop and the Rev. Fathers drove to the Palace.

Later in the evening Bishop Lemmens gave a very interesting account of his travels. The chief purpose of his journey to Europe was to explain to the Pope the count of this diocese and to give him the count of this diocese and to give him the count of this diocese and to give him the count of this diocese.

"It was in October," said the Bishop, "when I reached Rome, a very favorable time of the year to see the Pope. In ten years the Bishop had to go to Rome. While there he had the pleasure of a private audience with the Holy Father and was also present at a public audience. By the way, I may state that the Pope said a good word for the press of Victoria. It happened that he asked me whether we suffered any vexations from the non-Catholic portion of the community. I explained to him the fullest religious toleration existed in British Columbia, and that the secular press spoke with respect of religious matters, including the Roman Catholic faith. I explained also that not unfrequently the Pope's own utterances were referred to with approval and mentioned, especially the Encyclical on Labor. This pleased the Holy Father very much.

"You are," he said, "more favored than we are here in Italy, where often we see religion reviled in the pages of the press." "The Pope has an immense amount of vitality yet and may still live a number of years," continued the Bishop. "When I first saw him, sitting in his chair, he looked very old and frail, his flesh having almost transparent look. Yet when he talked, his eyes flashed, his features became animated, and he looked a different person. We conversed in French and he seemed to take a great deal of interest in our work in this part of the world. When our audience was concluded, he asked if I could speak Italian, and when I replied that I could not converse in it, but understood it, he insisted on my being present at a public audience which he gave in the Vatican to 600 Italian ladies and gentlemen.

"It was a splendid night in the grand hall. The ladies were dressed as is the custom at such occasions, while the gentlemen were wearing evening dress. The only bishop present, but there were four or five cardinals, including Cardinal Persico, who you may remember was sent on a mission to Ireland some years ago. The Holy Father entered the room borne in his sedia gestatoria by young Italian noblemen and was carried to a seat which stood on a platform at one end of the room. He gave audience to those assembled. I might add, that in his private audience with the Holy Father he spoke of the late Archbishop Seghers, whom he remembered very well.

"While in Rome I was invited to dinner by Cardinal Ledochowski, head of the Congregation of the Propaganda, and there I met Bishop Pasol of Alberta. I was surprised at finding the Cardinal possessed so much information of the Pacific coast—it was really astonishing.

"My visit to Rome extended through two weeks, and my time was well occupied. I had travelled there by easy stages from Holland, visiting Bologna, Venice, Milan and other interesting places, and would not have taken an interest in the magnificent churches. But after all there is nothing to compare with St. Peter's, with its wonderful mosaics that have the appearance of delicate paintings and keep a freshness that could not otherwise be obtained.

"I saw the scenery of Switzerland and passed through the wonderful St. Gotthard and Monte Cenis tunnels. When it comes to scenery, however, we have it here in British Columbia much grander than that of Switzerland. I went from Rome back to Limburg, where I left my parents in good health when I started on my return journey to Canada. From Rome I met two young ladies, Miss Byok and Miss Weimer, came out under my guidance to begin their novitiate in the convent here.

"After spending some time in the Eastern States visiting friends, I went to Montreal, where I officiated at mass in the Immaculate St. Peter's cathedral there. I spent a couple of days in Ottawa and one in Winnipeg on my way to the coast."

The reception to be tendered Bishop Lemmens by the congregation of the cathedral is arranged for Thursday evening at 8 o'clock in Institute hall.

NEW YORK, May 14.—The holiday at London (Whit Monday), and the annual election at the local stock exchange curtailed trading in stock circles, and to-day only 80,325 shares were traded in, as against 107,200 in the four previous days. The official orders were received last night, accompanied by a copy of the British edicts on the arrival of which the departure has been hinged. The fleet includes the warships Mohican, Adams and Alert, cruiser Yorktown, outposts Rush and Albatross. The route is hence to Sitka, thence to Omak, which will be the northern headquarters of the fleet. The British patrol fleet includes H.M.S. Nymphs and Phosant.

The case of Gabriel v. Mosher opened yesterday before Mr. Justice Walkem and a special jury and after continuing all day was adjourned till 10 o'clock this morning. In this case the plaintiff sues for \$10,000 for alleged negligence as the result of which he sustained injuries by the breaking of a plank on the ceiling of the Bank of B.C., while in the defendant's employ. The case came up for trial first in January, 1893, when the plaintiff was awarded \$3,500 but this award was set aside on the grounds that certain evidence had not been properly placed before the jury. The defence is that a competent person was employed and that there was contributory negligence. When the case for the plaintiff was closed yesterday Mr. Bodwell moved for a nonsuit but Mr. Justice Walkem said he would not take the case from the jury and did not call upon Mr. McPhillips. The case for the defence was in progress when the court adjourned at 6 o'clock.
