Montgomery asked legal adviser the following:—Has the Parish or District Clerk who is a brother-in-law of a candidate any right to throw out a nomination paper which reads according to the act all except the last word, which word is year instead of term, and declare his brother-in-law elected, and that the answer be given in writing.—Carried.

The Council then adjourned.

Wednesday Morning.

The Council assembled at 11 o'clock.

The minutes of the previous meeting were read and confirmed.

Coun. Montgomery moved that all the papers in reference to Nathan McDavid's protest be sent to the Attorney General for his opinion, and that his answer be recorded on the minutes.—Motion lost.

Coun. Dickie moved that owing to an error in the wording of the nomination papers of Nathan McDavid they were not legal, but no willful wrong was done and that the \$50.00 deposit be refunded to Mr. McDavid by the Sec.-Treasurer.—Carried.

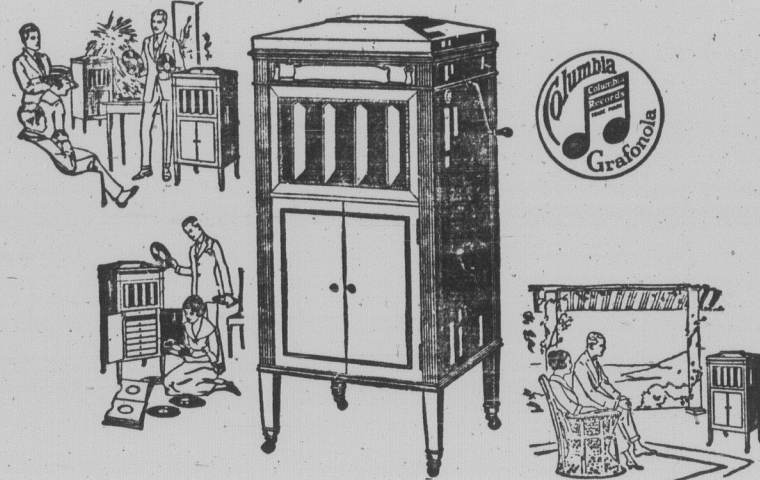
