BY-LAW NO. 6935

To fix the time to forward to the Assessment Commissioner statutory Declarations as required by Section 19a of the Assessment Act.

By-law therefore enacted by the Municipal Council of the City of London, as follows:

1. Every person in receipt of an income liable to assessment in the City of London shall on or before the thirtieth day of April in each year forward to the assessment commissioner of the City of London a statement of his income, according to the form referred to in subsection 1a of section 18 of the Assessment Act, provided, however, that this section shall not apply to persons who have made a return to the assessor or assessment commissioner on request, as provided by said section 18 of the Assessment Act.

2. Any person convicted of a breach of any of the provisions of this by-law shall forfeit any pay, or commission of the convicting magistrate, a penalty not exceeding (exclusive of costs) the sum of fifty dollars for each offense; and in default of payment of said penalty and costs forthwith the said penalty and costs, or costs only, may be levied by distress and sale of the goods and chattels of the offender; and in case of there being no distress found out of which such penalty can be levied the convicting magistrate may commit the offender to the common jail of the County of Middlesex, with or without hard labor, for any period not exceeding six calendar months, unless the said penalty and costs (if any), including the costs of the said distress and sale, and the costs of the said jail, are sooner paid.

Instructions Issued by the Assessment Department.

Persons required to file return of income under By-law No. 6935.

1. Personal earnings in excess of \$2,000.

2. Any interest from any investment which exceeds \$1,500 (total income includes rents or other income whatsoever).

3. Widows or persons who were over 60 years on or prior to 31st of December, 1922.

4. Persons exceeding \$2,000 from any source.

By-law No. 6935 applies to person resident on Saturday by the City of London.

SPECIAL SHOWING OF PICTURE TO TEACHERS Big Educational Film Coming to Patricia Is Approved Of By Teachers.

Members of the teaching staff of London's schools were entertained by the management of the Patricia Theater on Saturday, to a special showing of a big educational film, "Hunting Big Game in Africa," which opens a three-day run in the city at this theater next Thursday.

The picture is of particular value as an educational medium and it is for this reason that members of the teaching profession are invited to attend the showing.

The cameraman who took this picture braved death on many occasions during its production, but a more realistic depiction of wild outdoor life has never been shown. It is described as being better than any three-ringed circus ever witnessed for it contains actual life photographs of elephants, tigers, lions, hippopotamuses and all the other beasts of the jungle.

The picture played for three months at the Lyric, New York, and has also made several lengthy runs in some of the other more important theaters on the American continent. It is declared to be a natural history record unequalled in history and containing the thrill of a swift-moving story.

The Toronto Board of Education approved of the film as an educational picture only a few weeks ago.
