From one of these orchards 11/3 acres, torty-three trees, the owner netted \$400, the most ever received previously being \$175. Another orchard of thirty trees harvested \$250 worth of applee. From another of three acres the fruit sold on the trees at \$250 while the unperspect orchards in \$350, while the unsprayed orchards in the district were practically worthless. It certainly pays to give the apple orchards a little care and attention.


