pá hū e, *v. t., fr. hū or hūe*; to spill out, to pour; to empty by pouring.

pá ka dé, *v. t.*; to stick into or thrust through, to impale.

pá ká pi, *v. t., fr. kapi*; to be torn, as in walking through rose-bushes.

pá kī di, *v. t.*; to push, to shove away with the hand.

pá kī ši, *v. t.*; to rub gently in one direction with the hand, as in smoothing the hair or stroking a cat.

pá kī ti, *v. t., fr. kiti*; to press to smoothness, to make smooth by pressure with the hands.

pá mī di, *v. t., fr. midi*; to twist with the hand.

pá mī tsi [-witsi], *v. t., fr. mī-tsi*; to cut fine by pressing on with a knife held in the hand, as in cutting up tobacco or other material on a board preparatory to smoking.

pá mū dsi [-wudsi], *v. t.*; to roll up with the hands, to roll as a long strip of cloth or carpet or bandage is rolled; to fold or pack by rolling.

pá sá kī, *v. t.*; to engirdle or cover, as with a belt.

pá sá kī, *v. t.*; to love or like; possibly a figurative application of pašaki, to engirdle.

pá škú, *v. t., fr. škú*; to extract by pushing with the hand, to shove a cork into a bottle, to push a bullet out of a wound.

pá' tá, *imperative of pá'te*.

pá tá kī, *v. t.*; to place in contact. See ipataki, kipataki, and makipataki.

pá' te, *v. t.*; to turn over; to tumble over.

pá ti, *v. t.*; to fall down off of, to drop from a height.

pá ti he, *v. t.*; to throw or knock down; to throw down from.

pá ti ke, *v. t.*; to cause to fall, to throw down, to remove a support and allow to fall.

pá tó' ti, *v. t., fr. to'ti*; to wave or agitate back and forth; to wave with the hand; to make a signal by waving.

pá tsa kī, *v. t., fr. tsake*; to cut; to cut with a knife or instrument held in the hand.—patsak, imperative.

pá tsá' ti, *v. t., fr. tsati*; to puncture.

pá tsa ti, *n.*; the west, the land to the west of the Hidatsa.

pá tsa ti ha, *adv.*; westward.

pá tsa ti koa, *adv.*; at or in the west.

pá tska, *adj.*; flattened, having one or more plane surfaces.

pá tská pi, *v. t., fr. tskápi*; to prick with a pin; to stick with an instrument held in the hand.

pá tskaš, *n.* proper. See Local Names.

pá tski di a, *n., fr. patska*; cactus, particularly the different species of *Opuntia* or prickly pear.

pá tski di a ó ka, *n., fr. patskidiaoki and a*; the round cactus of the Upper Missouri, which bears a pleasant edible fruit.

pá tski di a ó kī, *n., fr. patskidia and oki* (alluding to the way in which the fruit grows on the plant); the fruit of the round cactus or *Mammillaria*. The name has recently been applied to figs.
