NICE COOKIES.—One egg, one half-cup of sugar, one cup of molasses, one teaspoonful soda, one tablespoonful of vinegar, little salt and spice to suit the taste. These are

SAUCE FOR PUDDING.—Cream together till very light, one cup of butter and one cup of sugar; flavour to taste. Add two tablespoonfuls of boiling water, beat well and send to the table immediately.

BATTER PUDDING.—Four eggs, eight tablespoonfuls of flour, one tablespoonful of butter, one pint of milk. Melt the butter in the milk; beat the eggs separately, bake half an hour and serve with sauce.

CREAM CAKE. - One egg, one cup of sugar, one cup of cream, one teaspoonful of soda, a little salt, and extract of lemon, two and one-half cups of flour. This makes a very nice loaf cake or a Washington pie.

CHAMPAGNE COOKIES. - One cup of sugar, one-third cup of butter, one egg, four spot fuls of sweet milk, one teaspoonful of cre-tartar, one-half teaspoonful soda. I ha kept cookies made by this receipt a year.

FRUIT CAKE .- Four eggs, one cup of sugar, one cup of molasses, one cup of sweet milk, one and one-half cups of butter, five cups of flour, one pound of raisins, one-half pound of currants, one teaspoonful of soda, citron, cinnamon, cloves and nutmeg. This makes two large loaves.

ALMOND CAKE.—Whites of five eggs, four teaches sinnsifted flour, two teaches of sugar, one-half cup of butter, one-half teaspoonful of soda disselved in a teacup of sweet milk, one-half teaspoon cream tartar sifted with the flour. This the sugar and butter, then the other logredients, stirring the flour in gradually. Best very hard and flavour with almond.

PLUM PUDDING.—Soak a loaf of bread in PLUM PUDDING.—Soak a loaf of bread in boiling milk; when cool, add four eggs, one-half pint of suet chopped fine, one teacup of brown sugar, one pound of raisins, one-half pound of currants, a large piece of citron cut in small slices, one teaspoon of allspice, gloves, mace, cinnamon and nutmeg, a little salt; beat two tablespoonfuls of flour into the bread and milk; boil four hours.

MOCK MINCE PIES.—One egg, three-fourths of a teacup of rolled crackers, two-thirds of a cup of sugar, one-half cup of molasses, one-fourth cup of cold tea, one-fourth of a wine glass of brandy, one-half cup of melted butter, one-fourth cup of vinegar, one cup of chopped raisins, one-fourth teaspoonful of salt, a little citron size of thin, nutmeg, cloves, allspice, mace and cinnamon a very little of each.

CREAM CAKE.—One-half cup of butter, CREAM CAKE.—One-half cup of butter, three eggs, one and one-half cups of sugar, one cup of milk, one teaspoonful of cream tartar in the flour, one teaspoonful of soda in the milk, two and a-half cups of flour. Bake in jelly-cake pans. Make a custard of one pint of milk, two tablespoonfuls corn-starch, one cup of sugar, two eggs beaten well together and stirred in the milk while boiling; place this between the layers of cake.
