Resolution 123 (VI)E- 2 March 1948 - Privileges and Immunities of Members of the Permanent Central Opium Board.

The resolution recommended that Governments should extend to the members of the Permanent Central Opium Board privileges and immunities on the lines laid down in the United Nations Convention on Privileges and Immunities.

No action has yet been taken by the Canadian Government in this regard.

Resolution 131 (VI) - 19 February 1948 - Co-ordination of cartographic services of specialized agencies and international organizations.

The Economic and Social Council recommended that Member Governments stimulate the accurate survey and mapping of their national territories.

In a Note to the Secretary-General dated 10 May 1948 the Secretary of State for External Affairs of Canada advised the Secretary-General of the United Nations as follows concerning this resolution:

- The Canadian Government is fully cognizant of the need for adequate maps and is proceeding with the mapping of its own territories as rapidly as circumstances permit. The Canadian Government recognizes that the interchange of technical information between organizations engaged in similar activities is always desirable.
- The Canadian Government, in accordance with the request of the Secretary-General that Member Governments forward during the current year a Statement showing the action taken and progress made in surveying the mapping of national territories, will prepare and forward to the Secretary-General index maps showing the progress to date in the mapping of Canada.
- In implementation of paragraph 2 of the resolution the Secretary-General was advised that the appropriate Canadian governmental authority with which the Secretariat might communicate on cartographic matters is the Department of External Affairs.
