the Government. There is the use of Petro-Canada, the government oil company, which got going in the Parliament of 1972 to 1974, of which the Minister spoke so badly.

Mr. Siddon: What is the matter with mixed enterprise?

Mr. Waddell: There is nothing the matter with mixed enterprise. I am not against that. I do not believe the Minister is. We should be using Petro-Canada, using private industry, to get things going for British Columbia. As a Member from British Columbia, I say to the Minister that we are going to keep after his Government to look after the interests of British Columbia, because the province is out of step.

We have great tourist potential. I know the Minister believes in education, as I do, and we cannot have this dispute

between the provincial Government and the Vancouver School Board or the Cowichan School Board. Only the kids suffer. British Columbia somehow has to get hold of itself and get some economic leadership in order to develop the province in the way it can be developed. Let us go after what I call the "green gold", that is, the forest industry and our fisheries. We are going to keep after the Minister and that is why we proposed this motion today.
