Dear Miss Hurlbatt: -With reference to your letters of May 4th and of April 23rd, let me say that as a result of mature consideration I have decided on the following line of action: At the next meeting of Corporation I shall cause to be made a notice of motion to change the constitution of the Standing Committee for Physical Education, as appointed by Corporation. The change will provide for an additional member to the Committee, and that additional member shall be the Warden of the Royal Victoria College. I believe it will be a good thing to do this, because I think your advice will be of value and because there can then be no question of the interests of the women students being overlooked. I regard the Physical Director for Women as being the head of a sub-department of the Department of Physical Education, of which Dr. Lamb is the head. The Medical Office and the Director of the Department of Physical Education attend the meetings of the Committee in order that they may give the benefit of their advice to the Committee and to give explanations and suggestions when called upon to do so. I do not propose to recommend that the Physical Director for Women be added to the Committee.
