Finances

"Attention was called to the fact that a contribution of \$25,000. each from the National Research Council and the Empire Marketing Board to be used over a period of three years, beginning April 1st, 1932, would make available each year for the work of the Institute a sum of slightly more than \$16,000."


Inasmuch as the Empire Marketing Board discontinued their support of this work as from September 30th last, Dr. Tory stated that the National Research Council would continue to make provision for the work on the same basis as heretofore.

I have consulted with Dr. Cameron and he has no information with regard to the late Principal having taken the matter up with the Carnegie people.

Mr. Eagleson, Secretary-Treasurer of the National Research Council informed me, when he recently visited the College, that the National Research Council would likely make arrangements to take care of the necessary funds for the carrying on of the work of the Institute of Parasitology for the balance of the term - i.e. three years as from the first of April, 1932.

I do not know that any arrangements have been made for the future of the Institute but I have no doubt but that the National Research Council will be able to arrange for permanent funds for this work.
