acres each. We find that in the third direction agreeable to his majesty's Proclamation, that in case of a township not being fully settled with more than half the number fufficient they are allowed one half of such township, and the other half if granted, to be on condition of immediate fettlement thereon .-In the 4th direction his Majesty has been pleased to fay that where a person or number of associates have petitioned for a township, and have been to the grouble of exploring the fame, although they cannot be thought to have done much towards evincing any very ferious intention with respect to carrying the fettlement thereof into effect; yet he allows all fuch persons, one fourth part of the township on conditions of immediate settlement, and subject to the fees of fix pence, H. C. per acre, for the publie service. In the 5th direction his Majesty extends in goodness so far as to direct the executive council, to confider all fuch persons who purchased the pretentions of others, who had become discouraged by the long delays which took place in the passing the grants, he allows them to fand in the place of the applicants, whose pretentions they so purchased, and to receive grants in the same way, and fame quantities, and on the fame conditions as the first applicants.

Here we find a spark of honour yet lest, this is sufficient to evince the sincerity of his Majesty and ministers at home, and that for some gracious intention, not known to the public at large, and perhaps not generally understood by the executives, nor do we believe that they had any right to an explanation it was their special orders from their Royal Master. He has as good a right to keep all things in the dark from them as they have from us; and its their duty to obey him, they are placed as servants to do the will of their master, and in strict sense they
