

About 18 delegates were present, and the work before them was the distribution of grants amounting to about \$12,000 among 300 churches and preaching sta-tions in connection with the board. Two fields have become self-sustain-ing, 14 asked for decreased assistance, amounting to \$370, and eight for in-creased assistance, amounting to \$173. During the last quarter, 150 persons have been received by letter into the mission churches, and 154 persons have been baptized.
