Railway Company intends to use electricity for power purposes in the car shops in the east end, and to this purpose is preparing to have electrical machinery installed in the new addition, which will be erected shortly, to he car shops.

At present the Toronto and Ni-agara Power Company is applying to the Cominion government for a charter for a transmission line from Brantford to London, and it is hinted that the private company will be selling the power in London long before the Whitney government has concluded thinking over the scheme.
