The World's Wheat Supply: Beerbohm, Feb. 10, in dealing with the question of the wheat supply, has made several changes and modifications of itearly estimates of probable exports an imports. It has found it necessary to reduce the supplies expected from Russia and the Danube, and to increase its estimate of the quantities to be furnished by Nortl Americal and Argentina. It now makes the aggregate quantity required by all importing countries in 1898-49, 354 million bushels as a minimum.

The World's estimate has never varies ince last Angust, continuing it always a seven million bushels per week, or about 364 million bushels for the year.

Beerbohm estimates the quantity likely to be furnished by exporting countries 38 million bushels, and says that this is not anything like the full quantity that could be shipped, if prices were attractive, but Russia and United States are likely to hold back a large part of their crop. 'It is not so much a question how much America Russia and India can ship, or in othe words their capacity to export, as how much they will actually ship at presen prices. Neither America nor Russia is like by to export by any means its full surplus, because it will not be wanted."

The Visible Supply. The Visible Supply.

According to Bradstreet's compilation, the visible supply of wheat in the United States and Canada, east of the Rockies, during the seven weeks since Jan. 1, increased 6,063,000 bushels, as compared with a decrease of 1,187,000 bushels during same period in 1898. By referring to the Items in the Chicago statement of visible supply for week ending 18th inst., which showed a considerable decrease from previous week, in the face of very small week's exports, it is evident that this decrease was owing to non-arrival at the seaboard of wheat on rail, detained by the heavy snowfall in the neighborhood of New York and Philadelphia.


