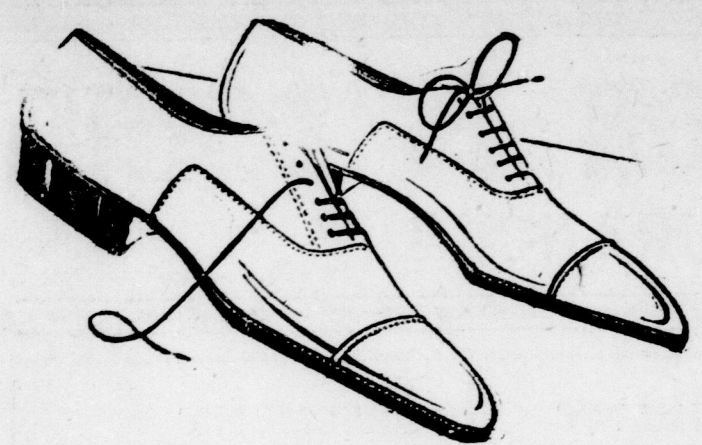

BOYS SWEEPED UNDER THAMES BY RAIN-SWOLLEN CURRENT

Have Narrow Escape Near Clark's Bridge.

GREATER CAUTION URGED

Supervised Swimming Holes Proper Places for Lads to Bathe.

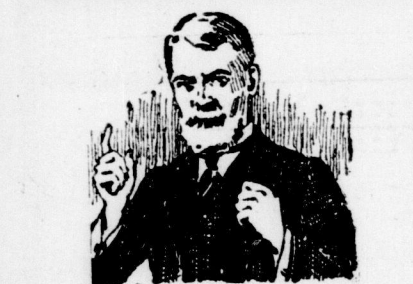
Swept off their feet as the swollen current of the Thames rushed along after the heavy recent rains, four boys resting near Clark's bridge had close calls from drowning Monday afternoon. The boys were swimming at the bend along Front street, and while accustomed to bathe at this point, they did not count on the strength of the river's flow. When they got over a mudbar, on which they played, all of them were in danger, and one of them, Gordon Dann, went under twice and was rescued with some difficulty by older boys who were nearby. When he was finally pulled out and picked up, he was so exhausted that he drew a deep breath and said: "Golly, that's better than ice cream!"

Charles Smith was being carried along in the deep water, when his feet struck a stone, and he was able to gain a footing. Another boy named Smith, and Tom Hines were in the party, and they all were brought to the bank after a struggle. All of the boys yelled hard and attracted help, otherwise one or two of them would have been drowned.

The river is crowded with boys since the warm weather started, and it is timely that a warning should be given to parents to caution their sons against taking chances. Each year the Thames causes the purchase of a number of little white caskets, and those who preach "safety first" are hoping that because of caution on the boys' part, no constant warning by parents, the sun-baked swimming holes are the proper places to go in the river.

COUNCIL IS NOT INTERFERING IN RAILWAY CASE

Conciliation Board Takes the Question Up at Special Meeting.

ASKS FOR SUGGESTIONS

Aldermen Declare Effort Made to Make City Responsible.

The city council decided yesterday afternoon not to interfere in the dispute between the Street Railway Company and its employees. The question was introduced at a special meeting of the council with the three members of the board of conciliation, Judge Livingston said at the conclusion of the discussion that they had the opinion of the principals to the controversy and wanted the opinion of the people as reflected by the members of the council. They got it. The members of the council reiterated their stand to take no action at present in regard to the question of increased fares. Not one suggested that they should change their stand.

Ald. Keene expressed the opinion that the move was one to draw the council into the controversy. If it failed, the whole blame would be laid at the door of the council. Controller Mayrhold took a more cheerful view of the matter. He said that the members of the board were evidently seeking information as to what had led the council to reject the company's application for increased fares. He believed that the council had concluded that the company could afford to pay the men a substantial increase out of its surplus earnings, and he thought the council should explain how it arrived at such a conclusion for the benefit of the board.

No Adjustment Yet.

When the meeting opened and after expressing his regret that the press was present, Judge Livingston said that so far his board had failed to bring about an adjustment of the dispute. The company said that its financial condition was such that it was not in a position to make an increase in fares. The council, on the other hand, said that it should take any action at all. However, he thought the council might have something to suggest that would bring about the desired result.

F. H. McGowan, the company's representative, said that the men were entitled to a wage increase, but the company could not afford to do so. Last year it passed its dividend and paid its stockholders out of stock held in the treasury. It was increased in wages, and there was no increased revenue there would be nothing left but a re-evaluation, else the stockholders go down in their pockets to make up the loss.

Chas. Ferguson, the men's representative, said he had nothing to add to what had been said.

What Men Want.

Ald. Holmes wanted to know what the men are asking. He was told a minimum of 14 cents an hour, and a maximum of 23 to 25 cents an hour. Ald. Ashplant said that the company's statement and figures did not agree. He pointed out that in presenting its case for increased fares it had picked out the worst material for its case. The company's own figures showed that it could afford to pay the men an increase.

Mr. McGowan had much stress upon the fact that the London and Port Stanley Railway was forced to ask for an increase in fares. He would have asked for more also, or the people would have to dip deep in their pockets.

What is Suggested.

Ald. Holmes suggested that to facilitate matters the council should be told the real move behind the meeting. Ald. Manne said it was to get the aldermen to change their minds. He suggested that they should reiterate their former decision.

Mayor Somerville said the board evidently appealed to the council in the hope that the council would do something to bring the company and the men together. The company would do something for the men.

Mr. McGowan said that the company was willing to make a pro rata increase to the men.

Ald. Keene threw the bomb into the meeting, however. He said that the meeting was called to place the council in a position where they would be forced to do something. He said that the council would now know what the men wanted, but had nothing on what the company was ready to offer.

Judge Livingston said at the conclusion that they had approached the question from the face of the matter, but that they had not been able to bring about a settlement. He said that they would now continue their efforts. There being no proposals before the meeting, motions to dispose of the matter were not necessary.

Bishop Pleads For Payment of Canada's Debt.

ESQUIMAUX WORK TOLD

Missionary Describes It at the Woman's Auxiliary Meeting Yesterday.

A meeting of the junior branches of the London occupied yesterday afternoon's session of the women's auxiliary, now being held in Cronin Hall. The Bishop of Huron was in the chair, and spoke a few encouraging words to the children on the subject of missions.

Of all the heathen races, it is to the American Indians that we owe the greatest debt," he said, "for to them we owe our country. In return, we should give to the Indians not only the riches of the gospel, but should try to educate them so that they may enjoy this country as much as we do. We are also in debt to the Chinese, Japanese and all the heathen races until we have given to them the gospel, for it was given to us that we might pass it on.

An interesting account of his work among the Esquimaux was given by Rev. W. J. Walton, who vividly described their peculiar customs and the conditions which surround them, and in so doing pointed out their anxiety to learn about the gospel.

"These Esquimaux have traveled as far as 800 miles, what would mean a two months' trip," he said, "just to spend three days with a Bible teacher. Their life is very hard, and food is scarce, made more so by the cultivation of great tracts of land by the English-speaking people in this coun-
