Encourages Workmen To Get Homes of Their Own.

New Zealand first of all provides for her mothers through the National Pro-vident Fund, which came into operation March 1, 1911. The professed aim of vident Fund, which came into operation March 1, 1911. The professed aim of this is "to aid the family from birth to old age." Anyone living in New Zealand whose income for three years previous has not exceeded £250 a year can join. It is a most extensive and cheap life and accident insurance. There is no medical examination, the applicant merely filling out a form at any postoffice and paying his first weekly payment—18 cents a week for ages 16 to 22, 24 cents a week for ages 16 to 22, 24 cents a week for ages ages 16 to 22, 24 cents a week for ages 22 to 25, 30 cents a week for age 25

After five years on the fund the contributor if absent from work because of sickness receives nearly two dollars a week for every child in his family under 14. (N.B.—Having children is encouraged in every way in New circulating in the blood and poisoning

Besides Mothers' Pensions.

After five years on the fund, if contributor should die a pension of nearly two dollars a week is paid for each child he leaves under 14, and the same to the widow, as long as any child is under 14. (N.B.—This does not prevent the widow also receiving the regular mother's pension from the state.)

At the age of 60 the contributor receives a weekly pension of \$2.50 for life, and this does not prevent him getting the old-age pension in addition.

If the contributor dies without receiving any benefits, or benefits not equal to his contributions, the difference is returned to his relatives.

Ontario Act.

In Ontario the government of Sir William Hearst was pledged to pass a mothers' allowance act on the following basis: The family must be residents of Ontario for two years. The father must have been a British subject. The father must either be dead, in insane asylum, or hospital for incurables. There must be one, or more children under fouror hospital for incurables. There must be one, or more children under fourteen. The mother and child, or children must own property valued at more than \$2,000 (exclusive of household goods), or \$500 in cash or bonds. The family must continue to reside in the province while receiving the pension; the exact amount of which was left to be arranged later.

The New Zealand law on this is called the widow's pension act. It gives a widow with one child under fourteen, \$60 a year (New Zealand has been able to keep the H. C. of L. down, so this means much more than it would here), also \$30 more for each additional child under fourteen. child under fourteen. May Have Home.

May Have Home.

The provisions regarding the father's condition, nationality, and residence, are much the same as in our proposed law; but the mother can own property bringing in an income of not more than \$150 a year; also her earnings must not exceed \$500 a year; but she can own in addition to a home—if she lives in it—assessed up to \$1,700. This is the only one of the many ways, in almost all their laws, wherein New Zealand does so encourage her workingmen to get so encourage her workingmen to get homes of their own. And it would be good for our mothers' pension act to let the widow own a small home, if she lived in it; and also we should take her earnings into consideration before deciding what her state pension should be. —Women's Century.
