

o Mr. Davey, he practiced his profession as a barrister and solicitor. He was the only son of the late Dr. Egerton Ryerson, the founder of the educa-ticnal system of the province. He is survived by his widow, formerly Miss Emily Beatty of Cobourg, and by five children, Rev. Egerton Ryerson, Anglican missionary in Japan; Dr. Stanley Ryerson of Toronto, John E. Ryerson of Toronto, and two daughters, Ella

and Isabel. In former years a captain in the Queen's Own Rifles he took part in the fight at Ridgeway. He was prominent in athletics, being identified with the Argonaut Rowing Club and the Victoria Club, where he went in for curling and bowling.

Mr. Ryerson was a Conservative in politics, and in religion an Anglican, being a member of the Church of the Ascension, of which he was church-warden from 1894 to 1896. From 1894 till 1904 he held the post of honorary lay secretary to the Anglican synod.

Death was due to heart disease, from which he had suffered for the past eight years. Until six weeks ago, how-ever, he was able to attend to his dut-

tes at the library.
