

YIELDS NEARLY \$10,000,000

Output of the Rossland Mines in Six Years—Rapid Advance of the Industry.

TRAIL CREEK DURING 1899.

Development Work and Ore Shipments—Quotations and Sales on the Mining Exchanges.

Below is given the report of Gold Commissioner John Kirkup on the progress made in the Trail Creek (Rossland) mining division of British Columbia, during the year 1899. It will be seen that the output of ore from Trail Creek mines, beginning with 1896 tons and valued at \$75,241.64, in 1894, had increased to 180,300 tons, valued at \$3,211,400, in 1899.

The most noteworthy features connected with the mining industry of last year are the increased production over 1898, when the output was 111,282 tons, valued at \$2,478,511, being an increase of 1886 of 69,018 tons and an increase of \$740,889 in value, amounting to 62 and nearly 30 per cent. respectively; the large amount of development work done, especially in the regular producing mines, the various extensions and modern character of the machinery employed; the successful flotation of the Centre Star Mining Company, its progress as a producing mine and a dividend payer and the large amount of work outlined for the future.

The ore shipments from the Trail Creek mines for the year ending Dec. 31, 1899, amounting to 180,300 tons, is made up as follows, odd figures having been deduced with:
