SHRINKAGE IN PRICES ON NEW YORK MARKET

Various Factors Tend to Weaken Quotations on the New York Stock Exchange.

NEW YORK, Jan. 22.—Subject only to occasional interruptions, the first four days of the week recorded a succession of selling movements in the stock market and an irregular shrinkage of prices, which was partly arrested yesterday.

In the steel market itself the event of the week was the Bethlehem Steel 300 dividend, which was received with some disappointment in speculative circles.

Prices reached lowest levels on Monday, but revived on information that other war contract issues are soon to distribute earnings to shareholders.

Next week's quarterly meeting of the United States Steel directors is awaited with special interest.

In the steel market, prices continued at high pressure, but metal markets are buoyant, with sales of copper running well into the second quarter of the year.

In all lines of trade and industry work continues at high pressure.

Timmins—A special meeting of Apex shareholders will be held on Friday at Fellat and Pellat's office.

The Dome Extension shaft has been pumped out to the 200-foot level.

It is rumored locally that Chicago people have acquired the old Preston claim in Delora, a short distance south west of the Dome.
