Detroit, April 4.—Charles Mellor, running under the colors of the Logan Square Athletic Club of Chicago, yesterday won the first annual Auto City marathon, Fontaine to Detroit.

Thirty-five contestants started at the courthouse in Pontiac at 12 o'clock.

Sheriff Irving Coffin being the starter.

Mellor, Ted Lapkins of the Illinois Sportsman's Club, and Saylor Minnick of the Logan Square Club, Chicago, were among the early pace setters.

Mellor was still in the lead after the first five miles, but dropped back to fifth position in the next mile.

After Kyrönen came Sidney Hatch, the veteran Illinois Athletic Club distance runner.
