The greatest defect in our agriculture is undoubtedly and waste. The disregard of order, system and economy, is the cause of our having, on the occasion of constant and immense loss in many ways. The most striking example of this, perhaps, is the great negligence in regard to the saving of manure. Neglecting the frequency with which this animal food is brought to the attention of farmers there is scarcely a neighborhood in which many hundreds of the best or best kind of food is lost. In most farms there is nearly a total loss of the urine of the stock; during the time it is kept in the barn it may be seen collecting the water of the stall and ditch which carry it away.
