
crete covers the rods completely, and settles against the sides of the forms, which have been washed with grease to prevent sticking. As soon as the concrete hardens, which it does in seven days, the forms are taken down and nothing but the canals remain, now transfromed into solid beams and girders of reinforced concrete. It is a common thing to hear spectators asking what the steel rods are for, and why the concrete is noured over tors asking what the steel rods are for, and why the concrete is poured over them. The explanation is simple. The concrete by itself, without the steel rods, is capable of withstanding great compression stresses, but it is not so able to withstand tensile or pulling stresses. Consequently, in a factory or other large building where there are various kinds of strains, the concrete needs aid in bearing this additional burden. Steel is the best medium known to withstand tensile stresses. The engineer therefore calculates the tensile and compression stresses of the building in question, and uses just enough steel rods to remove from the concrete the necessity of standing the stresses.
