Warns Against Players Union

President Johnson Says Move
Would End Present Salary
System

Filiation of the Baseball Players'
Fraternity with the American Federa-
tion of Labor would end the present
salary system in professional baseball,
by which the best players now receive
thousands of dollars for their work, in
the opinion of President B. B. Johnson
of the American League, who discussed
at New York Tuesday the plan to union-
ize baseball players. He asserted the
change would mean that a union scale
of wages would be paid both to the star
and the average player in accordance
with the amount of money his position
called for. He doubted if the stars of
the game would make such an agree-
ment.
President Johnson recalled that in the
old National League, wages were stand-
ardized when owners found it difficult to
pay the large salaries some players re-
ceived years ago, and he cited the case
of McPhee, the famous second baseman
who, he said, had to be satisfied with
the same pay that players of inferior
skill received.
"Under the plan at that time," Presi-
dent Johnson declared, "outfielders got
a certain sum and infielders, if they
agreed, were to receive another amount."
President Johnson said he was unwill-
ing to believe that present day baseball
players, drawing large salaries would be
content to equalize their earning abil-

ties with players who just manage to
hang on to the major leagues.
President Johnson said he hoped
Samuel Gompers would first consult with
his associates before taking up the propo-
sition, adding that the American League
has never been antagonistic to the Ameri-
can Federation of Labor.
