Commissioner Wigmore Presents Annual Report of His Department

**SHOWS FINANCES** 

Fire Engines Used But Few

FINANCES. During the last four years the sum of \$151,861.27 was transferred from water revenue towards the relief of the city assessment, against \$68,881.65 during the previous four years. Expenditures for water, sewerage and hydrant maintenance during the last-four years were nearly \$50,000 less than during the previous four years, notwithstand-ing that there has been no reduction in wages. As will be seen from the water assessment summary, the collections have been very satisfactory, less than 12 per cent. of the assessment remaining unpaid at the end of the year, and the collection of arrears being simtharly creditable. The receipts from meters, including supply to steamships, estimated at \$75,000, amounted to \$74,007.63, all accounts paid.

FIRE-FIGHTING. "It is very gratifying," writes Mr. Wigmore, "to know that our supply of water for fire-fighting has been improved to such an extent. During the year 1923 it was only necessary to use fire engines at three fires; during the year 1924 it was only necessary to use fire engines at four fires; during the year 1925 it was only necessary to use fire engines at three fires. At all other fires there was sufficient pressure at the hydrant, in many cases to use two streams off one hydrant, while previously it was necessary to use engines at all fires, and now they are only used on the highest levels in the city.

"In conclusion, I wish to thank Superintendent Walter Thompson, the foreman, and men of the department for their loyal support, as it is largely due to their co-operation that I have been able to make the splendid showing as above.


