PRESBYTERY MAKES INDUCTION PLANS

Calls to Woodstock and Moncton Churches Sustained at Meeting Here

At a special meeting of the Saint John Presbytery of the Presbyterian Church of Canada, held yesterday in Knox church, a hearty and unanimous call to Rev. A. G. W. Back, formerly of Fort Kent, Me., from St. Paul's

church, Woodstock, was sustained and, being placed in Mr. Back's hand, was accepted.

His induction takes place on Wednesday evening, December 9. The moderator, Rev. W. M. Townsend, M.A., is to preside and induct and will address the minister. Rev. Dr. J. A. Morison will address the people. Another call came from Moncton in favor of Rev. R. M. Stevenson, of Stornoway, in the Presbytery of Lewis, Scotland. This call was largely signed and carried a stipend of \$2,500 with one month's vacation. Mr. Stevenson has also accepted and his induction will take place on December 10. The moderator will preside and induct and Rev. F. G. Mackintosh

will address the minister, and Rev. Dr. Morison the people.

TO CONSIDER BUDGET.

A committee was appointed by the Presbytery to consider the apportionment of the budget, which the church aims to raise this year and in 1926. The recommendations of the committee are being forwarded to each congregation within the presbytery. Those present yesterday were: Rev. W. M. Townsend, moderator; Rev. E. J. Kerr, clerk, of St. George; Rev. Dr. Morison, Rev. A. G. W. Back, Rev. F. G. Mackintosh, Rev. C. S. Elliott. Elders: Lt.-Colonel Murray MacLaren, F. T. Murphy, I. W. Hutchinson, R. A. Campbell, J. A. Fraser and John Donald.
