


REPORTING BY WIRELESS (Halifax Chronicle)


A noteworthy feature of the news reporting of the International Schooner Races off Halifax was the continuous wireless service furnished by the Canadian Press. This was made possible by the installation by the Marconi Company on the Government steamer Tyrian the official press boat, of a special set providing for use of the Company's continuors wave system, which enables operation of the wireless while other ships in the immediate vicinity are sending in the immediate vicinity are sending or receiving on the regular wireless wave. an aerial was erected above the Canad-ian Press Bureau, Granville Street, Halifax, where the uninterrupted "running story" of approximately 3,000 words for each race was received direct from the press-boat.
