CONVICTION UNDER THE ESPIONAGE LAW.

Portland, Ore., Feb. 11.—J. Henry Albers, head of the Albers Brothers Milling Company, which operates in all of the large cities of the Pacific coast, was found guilty in the United States federal court on Wednesday on two of seven counts in an indictment charging violation of the espionage law. In the other five counts he was found not guilty. The counts on which he was found guilty accused him of uttering language intended to incite resistance to the United States and with favoring a country (Germany) with which the United States was at war. In Mr. Albers' defense his attorneys attempted to show that he had uttered the language complained of as a result of his being under the influence of intoxicants.

Delegations At The School Board

Members of Improvement League
Ask for Use of Buildings for
Community Purposes — Princi-
pals Heard in Opposition

R. B. Emerson, after nearly eleven years of office formally retired from the school board last night and in an eloquent address expressed his sorrow at severing a connection which had been such a happy one. The members of the board, Dr. Bridges and A. G. Leavitt each in turn replied to Mr. Emerson voicing his appreciation of a chairman who had been unfailing in his courtesy and consideration and had proved most diligent in the interests of the schools.

Three delegations waited on the board. One from the South End Improvement League asking for the use of the King Edward school assembly hall for community gatherings was opposed by another consisting of all the male principals voicing their objection to such use of the buildings. The third delegation was from the janitors asking for a further increase of salaries.

No action was taken with regard to any of the delegations, the matter of the use of school buildings being already in the hands of the chairman of the board and the superintendent of schools. A communication from the residents of Millidgeville asking for consideration of the school situation in that locality and was referred to the visitor, Mr. Coll and Dr. Bridges to report to another meeting. Much other business of minor importance was transacted.

Besides the chairman those members present were H. Colby Smith, E. R. W. Green, M. Coll and Dr. H. S. Bridges. The delegation from the South End Improvement League consisted of A. M. Belding, Rev. J. A. Mackigan, Rev. H. A. Cody, C. M. Lingley, J. M. Elmore, A. H. Ellis, Thomas Killen, Rev. George Scott, Commissioner Fisher, Rev. George Morris, Alexander Wilson and Commissioner Jones. Rev. H. A. Goodwin and Rev. S. S. Poole were unavoidably prevented from appearing as members of the delegation but were heartily in sympathy with it.

The delegation found every school principal in the city there to oppose them. A. M. Belding presented the case for the delegation, asking for the use of one of the unused assembly hall of King Edward school. He was briefly supported by Rev. H. A. Cody, Rev. George Scott, and C. M. Lingley, all of the schools staff opposed the request of the League. Mr. Belding suggested that the board grant the use of the room arranged for the meeting for tomorrow evening, and that members of the board and teachers be present to judge for themselves. The board decided not to grant permission for this meeting.

On the motion of Mr. Day and in consideration of the hopes of the retiring chairman, a motion of three was adopted to consider the matter of appointing a supervisor of buildings. The committee appointed was as follows: Mr. Day, Mr. Smith and Mr. Nagle.

A grant of half pay until the end of June was given in favor of Captain J. Gale, on the motion of Mr. Day. Captain Gale has returned from overseas, but his health is too shattered to enable him to take up his profession of teaching again. On the motion of Mr. Nagle three months' additional pay was given to the janitor of St. Michael's school, who was retired last December.

The meeting then adjourned until the following Monday.

Huns Prepared To Strike Again?

London, Feb. 10.—(British Wireless Service)—British newspapers of all shades of opinion are devoting serious attention to the attitude adopted by the German government toward the armistice conditions.

The correspondent says he has been informed by a competent British authority that Marshal Foch "made a declaration of somewhat serious character at a meeting of the supreme war council."

"He feels," this authority is quoted as saying, "that the Germans are beginning to forget that they are in a state of war. They have been slow in handing over transport and other things. They are causing a great deal of difficulty."

"We are demobilizing, they are not continuing to demobilize. There is danger of Germany saying, 'We do not care anything about your league of nations, and we have got our troops' unless a change takes place we might be faced with a situation in which Germany, as regards the number of men in the field, will have three men as against the Allies' two."

"According to Marshal Foch's estimate the Germans are now capable of placing an army of three million in the field in two months' time."

WEST ASKING FOR BIG GOVERNMENT BUILDING PROGRAM

Regina, Sask., Feb. 10.—Mayor Hardie, of Lethbridge, Alberta, and Captain MacKenzie, president of the Great War Veterans' Association, left Regina on Saturday night for Ottawa as authorized delegates of Saskatchewan and Alberta in the dominion reconstruction committee.

They will present to the federal government a resolution passed by the conference of mayors of Saskatchewan and Alberta, held in Regina.

They will present to the federal government a resolution passed by the conference in which the government is urged to inaugurate an extensive building programme in western Canada in order to provide employment for returned and returning soldiers. The resolution advises the government that there is a feeling of unrest in western Canada and that steady and sufficient employment will be necessary to check labor unrest and economic depression.

ALLIES SHIPS GATHER TO WELCOME SWEDISH FLEET.

Copenhagen, Feb. 11.—British, French and American warships arrived here yesterday to welcome the Swedish fleet, which is to pay a visit of courtesy in Danish waters. Dinners have been arranged for the visiting naval officers and men.

WINNIPEG CITY COMMITTEE SUGGESTS A NEW TRIBUNAL

Winnipeg, Feb. 10.—A tribunal at which capital and labor shall have equal representation and by means of which it is hoped to solve the problem arising out of Canada's demobilization of fighting forces was proposed at today's meeting of the city's committee of twenty chosen to deal with problems affecting returned men. A resolution asking the provincial government to form such a tribunal was held over until Wednesday.

Reduction of the high cost of living, the housing question, standardization of wage schedules, hours of labor, unemployment, and other important questions were dealt with in the resolution.
