FATAL STABBING IN DOMINION PARK

Assistant Manager of Inn Held in Connection With Death of Waiter

Montreal, June 21.—Wentworth Mosley is held pending an inquest into the death of Wm. Biles, forty years old, who died in the general hospital last evening following a stabbing affray in Dominion Park late in the afternoon.

Biles was a waiter for the Riverview Inn and Mosley the assistant manager. Mosley declared that Biles had attacked and cut him with a knife. He did not admit that he had stabbed the man.

Biles died in the hospital without an ante mortem statement being taken, but it is said that, following an argument, Biles stabbed Mosley in the hand and then dropped to the floor with blood gushing from a wound in his side.

According to a statement made by Mrs. Biles, the quarrel arose through Biles objecting to Mosley's use of language which he did not think proper before some women who were present.
