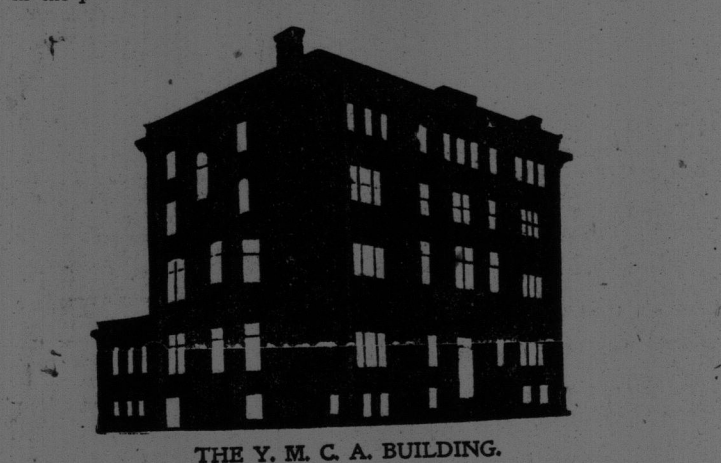


RELWIND CAMPAIGN FOR NEW Y. M. C. A. MEMBERS

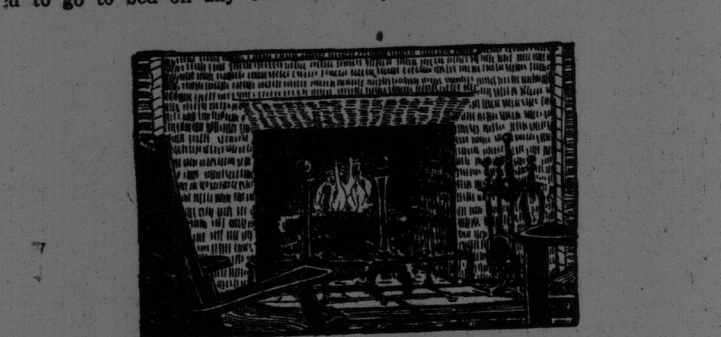
Teams Chosen for the Work and Good Results Are Expected—Work That is Being Done at Present.

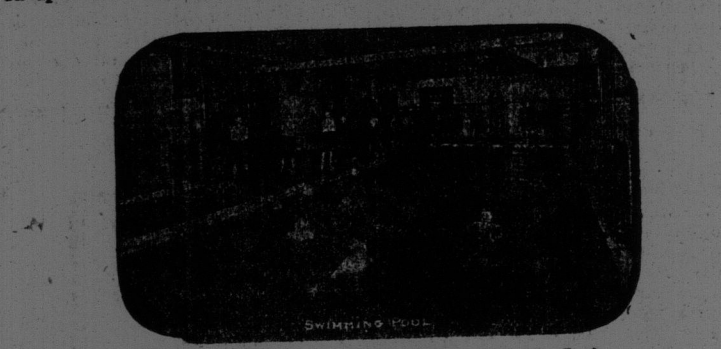
THE Y. M. C. A. BUILDING.

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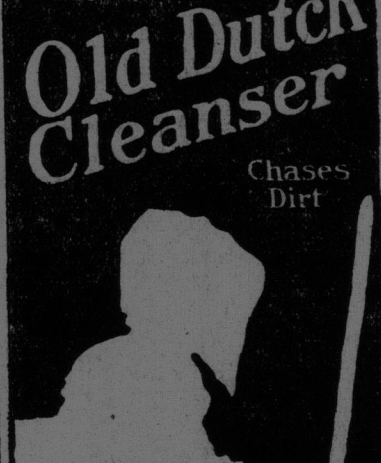
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MRS. WELLS, FIRST POLICEMAN, TELLS OF WORK

Much Accomplished That Male Officers Could Not Do—Chiefly Concerned With Women and Children

Mrs. Alice Stebbins Wells, of Los Angeles (Cal.), who has been described as the pioneer policewoman of America, addressed a large meeting under the auspices of the Women's Council last night, at the York Theatre, on the subject: "The Need of Policewomen and Their Work." Mrs. Wells, who is a fluent speaker and whose address was greatly appreciated by the audience, was introduced by Mayor Frink.



The speaker has long been deeply interested in social work and has thus been able to deal more effectively with the various matters officially entrusted to her as a policewoman clothed with the same powers and authority as a policeman. She remarked, on opening her address, that the police are a "peace army," but are a body less understood, perhaps, than any other body of public servants. They are not appreciated as they should be, and their work was much more arduous than most people imagined. She was amazed to hear how poorly they are paid in Canada, and thought a change in this respect would be sure to come.

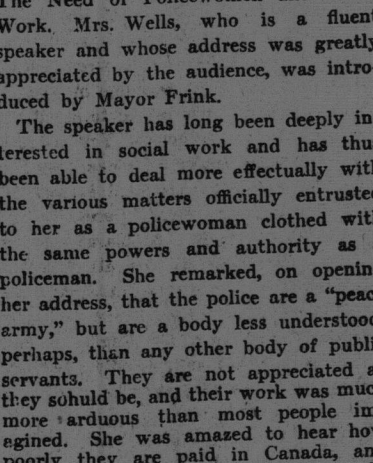

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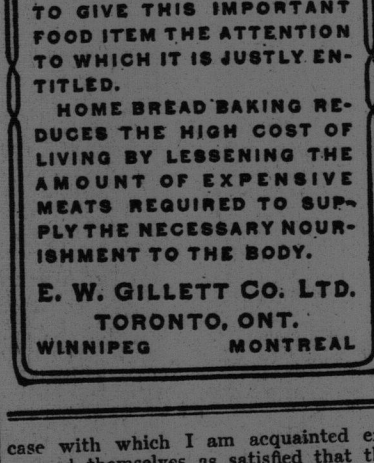
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OUR SHIPS AND OUR BOYS

The Navy Sentiment in Australia—Broken Faith at Ottawa

(Halifax Recorder.) While Halifax is welcoming the British warship "New Zealand," there comes an interesting description of the mighty welcome given the new Australian fleet in Sydney, where the enthusiasm knew no bounds and the heart of Australia beat high with pride to greet her own ship manned by her own sons. The last time that Sydney welcomed a powerful fleet was when the American squadron called at the port on its world tour, and the Sydneyites speak proudly of the fact that their own battleship could blow any two of the same American ships out of the water with ease. And the old song is again heard in the streets.



"We're hanging out the sign from the Lennox to the line. This line of the world belongs to us." Five years ago when the American fleet came, Mr. Deakin, then premier, thus spoke: "We live in hopes that from our own shores some day a fleet will go out unworthy to be compared with the magnificent fleet now in our harbor." Five years have passed and the Premier Deakin's wish is well on the way to fulfillment, and Sydney is a proud city today. A correspondent to the London Times thus writes: "It is impossible not to make comparisons between the two occasions, but I write down only one. Amid all the enthusiasm and curiosity which marked the crowds of 1908 one note was lacking—the personal—that is very notable today. Never before have Australians, especially Australian mothers, watched the entrance of a squadron largely manned by their own boys. 'My boy's on the Sydney, and I must go down to the Heads to see him come in,' said one eager, tearful woman to the tram driver who slowed his overladen car on a steep grade. 'Our Tom was on duty when we went over the Australia; he would look at us and quite right too!' a father proudly told his fellow passengers on the ferry this morning, with the note for the absence of which no amount of contributions, skillfully engineered through parliament, could amply compensate. 'Our boys and our boys' will serve the empire better in times of stress than would the millions that Australia is spending on them."

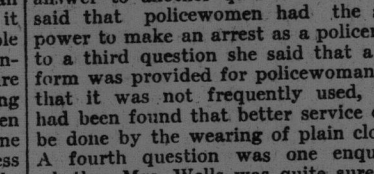
