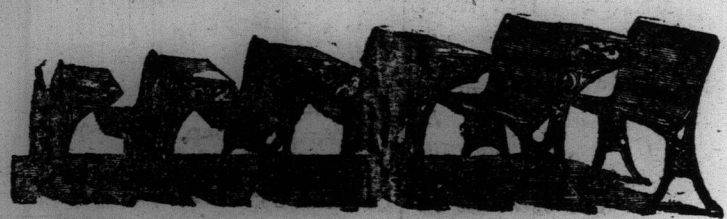

The rates of commission on Money Orders issued by any Money Order Office in Newfoundland to the United States of America, the Dominion of Canada and any part of Newfoundland, are as follows:

For sums not exceeding \$10 - 5 cts
Over \$10 but not exceeding \$20 - 10 cts
Over \$20 but not exceeding \$30 - 15 cts
Over \$30 but not exceeding \$40 - 20 cts
Over \$40 but not exceeding \$50 - 25 cts
Over \$50 but not exceeding \$75 - 30 cts
Over \$75 but not exceeding \$100 - 35 cts
Over \$100 but not exceeding \$250 - 40 cts
Over \$250 but not exceeding \$500 - 45 cts
Over \$500 but not exceeding \$1000 - 50 cts
Maximum amount of a single Order \$1000 in Newfoundland, \$1000, but as money may be obtained at the remitter's request.

HOUSE OF ASSEMBLY

(Continued from page 2.)

Mr. KENT made the usual observations, dealing with the increases. He believed that there was not that care in making up the estimates that should appertain, and probably the House would be called upon to vote additional estimates later on, because of this lack of care. He noticed the increase to the Governor, and believed no person in the country would like to see the incumbent in the office of Governor holding office unless adequately repaid for his service. This the country owed not only to the person holding the office, but to its own self respect. He thought, however, that the Government should have assumed the whole onus and responsibility for this increase without bringing in the Governor's letter. He would like to see the same principle applied to all the civil services, and a general levelling up of salaries take place. Reference was made to various individuals' salaries, and he wondered why some should have been picked up for special dealing, while others, equally deserving, were left out. Reference was also made to the division of last year's surplus and the use which was made of section 38 of the Audit Act, both of which he disagreed with. He also made his usual plea for the firemen and policemen.

MINISTER OF FINANCE pointed out that some of Mr. Kent's remarks were the same that had been uttered by members of the opposition for the past 20 years or more. It was next impossible to prepare the estimates perfectly correct. They were submitted by the Government to the House for discussion and nobody expected they would be agreed to unanimously.

HON. THE PREMIER stated the Governor's letter was tabled at his request, and not in justification of the Government's action in increasing the vote. If this information had not been tabled, however, the Government's action might have been misconstrued and the Opposition would have asked for information and tabled questions which could only have produced the same letter. Reference was also made by the Premier to the salaries of the policemen and firemen, and he pointed out the increases that had taken place in recent years. He dealt with the discrepancies between the salaries, spoke of the good work done by the deputy heads, generally dealt with the increases, and showed how impossible it was to bring down absolutely correct estimates because of unforeseen contingencies which it was impossible to gauge. As to additional estimates, there always have been and always will be over expenditure, but that was no proof that any wrong had been done. With reference to the Audit Act, the Government were doing the same to-day as always had been done. If one read the Auditor General's report for the past fifteen years he would find the same statements year after year with regard to extraordinary expenditures. During the past five years expenses had increased \$1,000,000, but that was because of absolute necessary expenses, such as \$100,000 per year for education, for hospitals, old age pension and poor fund another \$100,000; postal additions, \$100,000; interest on railway, \$250,000; light houses, fog alarms nearly a similar amount; steam communication another similar amount, and so on. It is impossible to have all these increased facilities without paying for them.

DR. LYON congratulated the Minister of Finance on his pluck in bringing down increased estimates and putting on many of the votes that were usually paid out of contingencies, but he thought he might have gone further bringing the increase up to \$200,000. He took an exception whatever to the increases and thought they were reasonable, as he did not believe in underpaying civil servants. He challenged the Minister's statements that the House could increase the Estimates, claimed the House had no right whatever to do anything but accept those brought down by responsible ministers, or more for reductions. He advocated an increase for the Ministers and standard salaries for the deputy heads, depriving them of supplemental amounts. He agreed with Mr. Kent that section 38 of the Audit Act was being wrongly applied in many cases. It applied to extraordinary expenditures.

It was resolved that this endorsement of the Government's Agricultural Policy be forwarded to the Premier, Sir Edward Morris, and to the press for publication.

41 Persons Lost

Norfolk, Jan. 30.—The most shocking tragedy in the history of the Atlantic coastwise trade was enacted off Hog Island, 60 miles north-east of Cape Charles, Va., in the early hours of today. Nineteen passengers and 22 members of the crew of the 4700-ton passenger ship *Monroe*, of the Old Dominion Steamship Company, lost their lives when the *Monroe* was rammed in the dense sea fog by the steamer *Nantuxet*, of the Merchants and Miners Transportation Company. The *Monroe*, rent from her stern clear to her engine room, filled and sank within ten minutes of the collision.

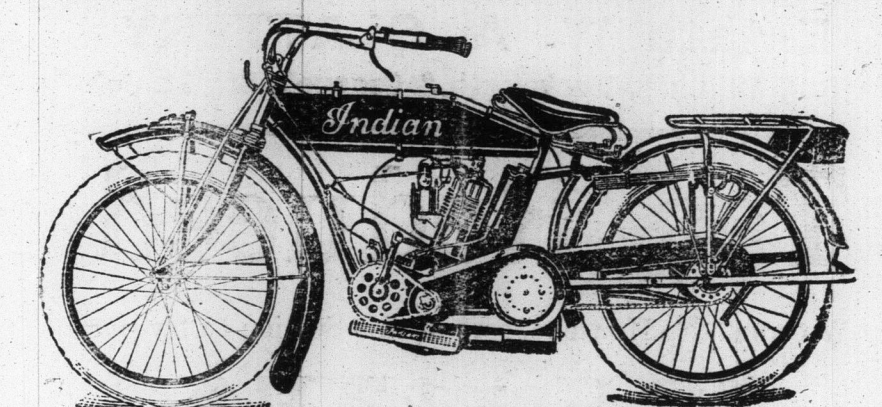
