Burnt Islands District of Burgeo—South West Coast

Latitude 47° 35' 40" N.
Longitude 58° 53' 00" W.
Notice is hereby given that two Red Lights have been placed on Great Burnt Island for the guidance of fishing craft of that harbour.

Structures—Wood, square in plan with sloping sides, 15 feet high from base to centre of light.
Colour—Both towers painted with two red and two white horizontal bands, lanterns white.
Remarks—Lights will be put in operation during month of January, 1915, without further notice.

N. B.—Burnt Islands Harbour affords good and sheltered anchorage for vessels of moderate size, but even with a small vessel no stranger should attempt to enter without a pilot, for the channels are not easily distinguished from seaward, and the numerous rocks give but little room for manoeuvring.

Public Notice

Censorship of Telegraphs, Cables, and Wireless Stations.

By direction of the Chief Censor, London, the following Regulations will be in force on and after Friday next, January 15th, namely:—
1. Cablegrams in authorized editions of A.B.C., Lieber's, Scott's and Western Union Codes only may be exchanged between British, Allied or Neutral Territory on extra European Telegraph System, on one side, and British or Allied Territory, wherever situated, on the other side.

2. The term "Extra European Telegraph System" means the places outside the Telegraph System of Europe. Besides the places in Europe proper, the following are also counted as being on the European Telegraph System, namely:—Russia and Asia; the following French possessions in North and West Africa, namely:—Algeria, Mauritania, Senegal, Upper Senegal and Niger; and French Morocco. The island of Cyprus is regarded as outside the European Telegraph System.

3. Until further notice cablegrams in the following three Codes, namely:—Meyer's Atlantic Cotton Code, Thirty-ninth Edition; Bentley's Complete Phrase Code, not including separate Mining and Oil Supplements; Broomhall's Imperial Combination Code, not including Special Rubber Edition, are allowed only between United Kingdom and places in Extra European Telegraph System.
N.B.—All messages sent under the above Regulations have to be decoded and enciphered the carrying out of this work will be greatly facilitated if persons sending such messages would hand in at the Telegraph Office, at the time of presenting the message, the translation of the same.

relation to the General Hospital, and would reserve his observations on it to the Committee stage. It was then referred to Committee on to-morrow.

The House then adjourned till to-morrow at 3 p.m.

Wednesday, May 5th, 1915.

The House met at 3 p.m., pursuant to adjournment.

The Premier, Mr. Moulton, Mr. Hickman, Mr. Clapp presented petitions.

Various questions were asked and answered.

The Local Affairs Bill was read a third time and sent to the Council.

The House went into Committee of the Whole on Supply.

Mr. Jennings thought something might be saved in relation to propagation of lobsters, as the fishery was not being carried on this year.

Minister of Marine and Fisheries said some 700 lobster packers licenses had already been issued.

Mr. COAKER asked when the Food Inspection Act would be in force.

Hon. Colonial Secretary said in a week or two. It had been delayed by the war. Mr. Coaker referred at some length to the Agricultural Policy, which he considered a failure.

The Premier pointed out that Mr. Coaker was selecting and reading out the worst reports of Agricultural Society, while passing over the many good ones.

Mr. Coaker considered the lobster propagation policy of the Government useless, and an inducement to the fishermen to commit frauds.

Hon. Minister of Marine and Fisheries defended the system, which was very necessary this year.

Mr. MORINE thought the Tuberculosis campaign was not being properly carried on. Dr. Rendell's work was devoted to curing individual cases in St. John's, when it ought to be devoted to the education and instruction of the people in preventive methods, as had been done by the Association for Prevention of Consumption. The Premier said that this work had been somewhat hindered, owing to the proposed sanatorium system not yet ready. When these were ready the work would take a more extended form.

Mr. LLOYD said the educative part of the campaign should be revived. Everyone agreed that it was more important to prevent than to cure the disease.

Mr. Lloyd objected to the regulations. Mr. Hickman thought the Act would require careful definition. Messrs. Grimes, Halfyard, Winsor, and Coaker opposed the bill. Mr. Higgins said the stamp tax was a war tax, and would be loyally paid. Mr. Morine said it was not a war tax, and it would be very troublesome.

Opinions on the Lusitania Situation

Doctor Hill, who was ambassador to Germany from 1908 to 1911, has expressed himself in writing as follows:

"When an appeal to the human conscience proves to be vain expedient, it is necessary to resort to other means to preserve the rights of citizens and the honor of a nation. Failure to do so would be an act of self-defence too ignominious to consider for a moment."

"There are extremes of endurance that are revolting to our better natures. The situation by which we are confronted is not only one of legality—it is a question of the future civilization."

"John Bassett Moore, professor of international law at Columbia University, former counsellor of the State Department member of the permanent court at The Hague and representative of the United States Government in the settlement of many international conferences and commissions, said to a group of his students yesterday:

"I do not believe the submarine has changed the long-established principles of international law. The submarine is only a new form of the old torpedo boat. We had torpedo boats during the Russo-Japanese war. The laws governing their operations have been clearly defined."

"The Lusitania was not a blockade-runner. The German submarines had not established a blockade of the great majority of the vessels were sailing in and out of these ports without interference."

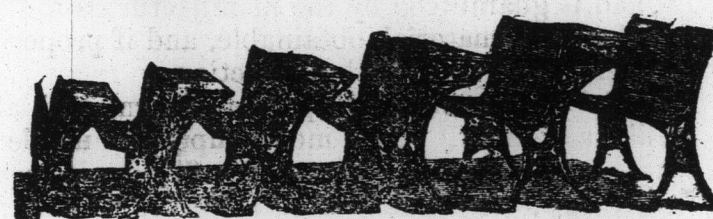
