

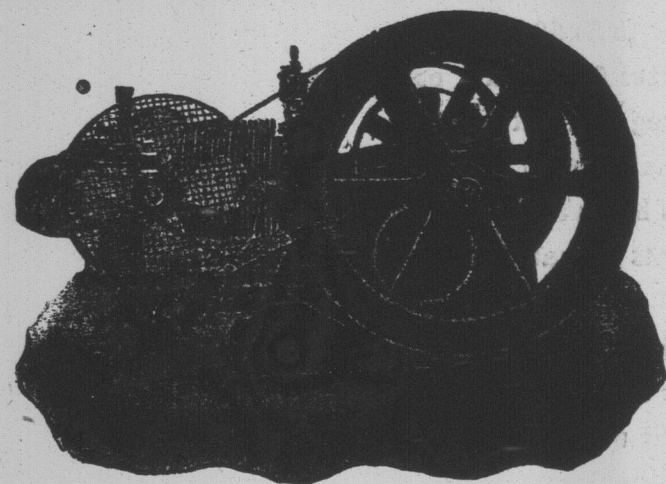

**NOTICE OF REAL ESTATE SALE**

D. 1909, there being a deficiency in the personal estate to pay the debts and costs of administration, in the estate of Daniel Campbell, late of Saint George in the County of Charlotte, intestate, deceased, I will sell at public auction, to the highest bidder, at or near Youngs Bridge, so called, in the Parish of Saint George in the County of Charlotte, at two o'clock in the afternoon on Saturday the twenty first day of August next, in separate parcels, all the real estate of which the said Daniel Campbell died seized and possessed, and which is described as follows, in the said license from the said Probate Court:—(1) All that certain lot, piece or parcel of land lying and being in the said Parish of Saint George commencing on the north line of land owned by the late Hugh Matheson, commonly called the Daily lot, on the road leading from the late Israel Thorne to the Second Falls, thence easterly along the said Daily line to the west line of the Bay of Fundy Company's Lands, thence following the said line North to the south line of land formerly owned by the late Robert Grey, thence westerly along said line and prolongation thereof to the south side of the Ash property thereof to the Magaguadavic River thence southerly along the east bank of the said River to the north line of the Taylor lot, so called near a gully on the interval, thence east along the said line to the aforesaid road, thence south along the said road to the place of beginning and being a part of the land formerly in the occupation of Thomas Moreland.

(2) Also a lot described in a deed from Phoebe Kelley to Thomas Barry, registered in Charlotte County Records in book 12 pages 291 and 292 and therein described as follows,—Also a piece of land situated on the south side of the first above tract and lying between the river and the road leading to the Upper Falls, containing about two acres as now fenced and occupied by Stephen Kelley in his life time, and which said lot is commonly known as the Kelley lot.
