ST. JOHN HUNTSMAN BAGS A BIG MOOSE

Moncton, Oct. 13.—Major J. S. Frost, a crack rifleman of the 62nd Fusiliers, St. John, and Mrs. Frost have been sampling for some time at Busley's siding, on the Campbellton-Moncton division of the Intercolonial, with 'Celle Steeves as guide. On Friday last Major Frost brought down at the first shot, a large bull moose with antlers having a spread of 52 1/2 inches. Major Frost is naturally much elated over his success, as this is his first experience in the deep woods.

At Weston, Kent county, on Saturday, John Fraser shot a white deer, which had been reported seen in that locality several times during the past summer. It is a very rare specimen, as the skin is pure white with the exception of the face and a few spots on the back. It was also a buck, with horns 5 inches long and the carcass weighed about 150 pounds. Mr. Fraser will have the skin mounted.

RAPPANNOCK HAS A RECORD CARGO. Monday's Halifax Herald says: Pursue liner Rappannock is due to arrive from London with 5,000 tons of general cargo to be discharged at Halifax. This is perhaps the largest amount of cargo landed here by any vessel of this line and by far the heaviest freight disembarked at this port during the present year. A quantity of the steamer's burden is for St. John delivery, but it will be transported to the sister city by rail, as the Rappannock is being rushed back to London in order to keep pace with the heavy rush of freight traffic now being
