Orpington, Kent.

Dear Mr. Sumner—Received your letter of the 21st today and was very pleased to hear from you. My right hand and wrist are "out of action" so I am trying to make use of my left, but am making a poor job of it. I am not wounded, but have rheumatism in my left hip and knee and in my both feet, and hand as I have mentioned. Am getting along fairly well. I went to France with the 6th Mounted Rifles eleven months ago. Shall be pleased to make your office my headquarters when I go on leave. My father's address is care C. P. R. office, West St. John.

## SYNOPSIS OF CANADIAN NORTH-WEST LAND REGULATIONS.

The sole head of a family, or any male over 18 years old, may homestead a quarter-section of available Dominion land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta. Applicant must appear in person at the Dominion Lands Agency or Sub-Agency for the District. Entry by proxy may be made at any Dominion Lands Agency (but not Sub-Agency), on certain conditions.

Duties—Six months residence upon and cultivation of the land in each of three years. A homesteader may live within nine miles of his homestead in the form of at least 50 acres, on certain conditions. A habitable house is required except where residence is performed in the vicinity.

In certain districts a homesteader in good standing may sub-let a portion of his land, but not more than 50 acres, on certain conditions.

Duties—Six months residence in each of three years after settling on the land. Duties—Must reside six months in each year. Duties—Must cultivate 50 acres of arable land each year. The area of cultivation is subject to reduction in case of rough, scrubby or stony land. Life stock may be substituted for cultivation under certain conditions.
