### "FLU" CLOSES PRISON DOORS

New York, Feb. 3—Danger that many influenza and 'pneumonia patients in the city would suffer from lack of heat has been removed. Tonght the stationary engineers and fremen working in hotels, apartment houses and public institutions called on their strike, which dwas to have begun tomorrow. Most of the men's demands have been met.

A curious phase of the epidemic is the order issued today at Sing Sing prison refusing to admit any more prisoners until the flu plague is over. There are now fifty eight cases in Sing Sing, including five condemmed murderers.

The Pennsylvania Health Department reports tonight 2,073 new cases influenza and twenty-six of pneumonia with twenty-nine deaths in ten counties, including Philadelphia, The latter city will vote \$100,000 to fight the epidemic.
