

FRANCE IN TOW IS CHARGE BY FRENCH SENATOR

Henry Berenger Complains That Lloyd George Leads Millerand.

ATTACKS FOREIGN POLICY OF FRANCE

French Offices Have Been Closed and All the Information Comes from the British Press.

Paris, Aug. 13.—Senator Henry Berenger, wartime chief of the army commission of the Senate, today in the Paris Midi put into words what many Frenchmen are thinking concerning the present political situation, following the same line as the recent utterances of Jules Cambon, president of the council of ambassadors to the Public Ledger. Senator Berenger under the heading "France in Tow" writes:

"One more Millerand has been sent to England to learn from Lloyd George what the latter has decided or has not decided from his conversations with the Soviet representatives. Afterward, France will be more or less informed—less rather than more—and more or less engaged—more rather than less. It was thus that matters were arranged at Spa with the Germans. Lloyd George decided and Millerand followed. Afterward the French Parliament was crossed with Lloyd George—who is responsible only to the British Parliament. Anyhow M. Millerand sent the French Parliament on a vacation, no doubt because he can conduct our foreign policy when testate only with President De Gaulle.
