While admitting there are two sides to the question, James A. Campbell president of the Yongstown Sheel and Tube Co., largest independent in the Mahoning valley, declares he acoposed to a general eight-hour day because, as a general proposal, mereannot earn more than a living by eight hours' work, whereas they should have opportunity to "put some thing aside for emergencies and old age." He filustrates his point by citing the emperience of Sweden where the Socialist parliament inaugurated an eight-hour day only to bring the ambieston, since, that it is

a fallure.

The independents point out that if their plants were to retain the longer work day employes would be able to earn more wages than in eight-hour mills, and there might consequently be a drift to the independents of men who desired the advantage of the additional compensation.

The majority of the leading independents are uncertain as to what effect the institution of the shorter da would have in the industry, althoug almost to a man they are heartily is accord with the movement to abolish the seven-day week and the lon shifts at turn changes.

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
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
