THE STEAMSHIP HONG KONG. Feb. 28. The steamship *Hong Kong*, from London to Japan, founded in the Indian Ocean. Nineteen persons reported saved, six drowned, and eighteen missing.

NEW YORK, Feb. 26. The steamship *Queen* was on a Spanish Deutch last night, being aided by a strong westerly gale which prevailed during the night. A large number of passengers arrived here by train last night, while some sixty remained on board, and will arrive here today on the vessel. She had no pilot on board, having been unable all night, Wednesday, in the dense fog to obtain one. It is believed that the vessel is not damaged materially.

LONDON, Feb. 27. The *Queen* and *Princess* were at their pier this morning, neither steamer damaged in the least, and the loss from the cargo was not overboard from the *Queen* slight.

RELIGIOUS LIBERTY IN SPAIN. The German government has received a memorial from the Protestant clergy of Spain, complaining that their liberty of worship is threatened. Similar memorials have been forwarded to other Protestant powers in Europe, and to the United States.

PARLIAMENTARY CHURCH. The *Journal des Debats* states that Mr. Buffet has declined to form a Ministry, but it is hoped that he will reconsider his determination. In the event of his acceptance the Left Centre will support Mr. Dufaure for President of the Assembly.

THE BANG BELL. The Bang Bell has been wrecked on the Irish Coast, off Ballinacorney, and thirteen of the crew drowned.

THE STEAMSHIP HONG KONG. From London to Japan, the steamship *Hong Kong*, owned by Messrs. A. & C. Co., sank at the Sugar Coast in Williamsburg, with 2,400 barrels of sugar on board, valued at \$70,000.

A MISSING STEAMSHIP. The steamer *Empire State*, for whose safety there has been great anxiety, was seen in the Sound by the steamer *Newport* from New York to Newport last night.

STEAMER WRECKED. The steamship *Vicksburg*, from Fort Royal, went ashore at dark last night, seven miles east of Fort Island light, and is a total loss. The crew were saved, all but the cook, who was drowned. She was owned by the New York and West India Steamship Company.

THE PARLIAMENT OF CANADA. After recess last night, Mr. Duggan made a forcible speech of several hours' duration in relation to the bill in connection with the Intercolonial Railway, and condemned the Government's policy of building in coal contracts, by which the country lost \$25,000, and referred to the *Empire State* disaster.

The blank was filled with the words "not less than four feet." The penalty for violation is fixed at not less than four feet, as the bill required, but the other half of the bill was not read.

Mr. Duggan moved that provision be added that one half of the fine be paid to the party prosecuting, and the other half to the Commissioner of Roads, to be expended in the purchase of land for the railway.

The bill was agreed to, and the House then adjourned.

After recess Mr. Keane introduced a bill for the establishment, maintenance and management of Religious and Industrial Schools; also, a bill to amend the law relating to the collection of rates and taxes in Lancaster, Simonds and St. Martin's; also, the petition of the Justices in favor of the Reforming bill, and a petition from the same in favor of a bill to amend the Highway Act.

Hon. Mr. Crawford introduced a bill to provide for the purchase of lands and the erection of an Alms House and Workhouse in King's. He also endeavored to present a resolution of the Session of the King's against the said bill, which Mr. Speaker ruled out of order.

FREDERICTON, Feb. 25. More Orange petitions were presented. Hon. Mr. Lindsay presented a petition from James F. Humphrey and fifteen others of Hampton to lay out streets there.

Hon. Mr. Hibbard introduced a bill to enable the shareholders of the Lake George Amusement Co. to hold meetings elsewhere than in Fredericton.

The bill to establish special courts of Order and Termination and general jail delivery was committed. Hon. Mr. Beckwith in the chair.

The object of the bill is to enable the Government to hold special courts in Counties where only one circuit is held. This Act was passed seven years ago, but it was doubtful if the Government had power to act under it.

Hon. Mr. McArthur was not prepared to discuss the bill without more information. Hon. Mr. Beckwith, who had taken charge of the bill in the absence of the member of the Government, progress was reported.
