Clerks Want to Close at 9 o'clock

Saturday Evenings

Shorter hours on Saturday evenings is the aim of the clerks in the stores of the city. It has been decided by them to circulate a petition among the merchants in order to secure their decision to bring the desired hours into effect. A number of the merchants, although the petition has only been started, have already signed and the prospects for the clerks securing the elimination of the late hours on Saturday evenings is bright.

Period Extended

While clean-up week had been set for one week and would have ended with to-day the time allotted for cleaning up has been extended. Many citizens have complied with the request to remove objectionable refuse on their properties thereby assisting the movement for better fire-protection and better health in the city. There are still some instances where the law has not been complied with. It was learned to-day that while no second notice ordering a clean-up would be given yet a further opportunity to do so would be given before the machinery of the law will be put into operation in order to enforce the order in cases where it is absolutely necessary.

Putting in Sewer Connections

The city engineer's department these days is busy preparing for the work of laying permanent pavements this summer. Yesterday Street Foreman Zettel had a staff of men begin laying sewer connections from the street to the private property line on Rose Street before the pavement is put down. A tarpis pavement is to be laid on this road. Other streets which will secure such a construction are Hahner Avenue, Louisa Street between Waterloo and Weber, Wellington between King and Waterloo, Margaret Avenue between Maynard Avenue and Queen. Petitions are also out for other streets which may be in before very long.

Comfort for Carvell

Hon. Frank B. Carvell, Minister of Public Works, who was condemned by the ministers of the Presbytery of London for having made a Sunday inspection of Port Stanley harbor, was compensated in a degree yesterday by the London Chamber of Commerce. The directors of the chamber, in a special session held for the purpose, unanimously adopted a strongly worded resolution, warmly thanking Mr. Carvell for his interest. Instructions were issued to send copies of the resolution to the Government at Ottawa, to Mr. Carvell personally, to Acting Mayor Little of London, Mayor Horton of St. Thomas, and the ministers who attacked Mr. Carvell's action.

Zionists Incorporated

Ottawa, May 9.—Incorporation has been granted to the Federation of Zionist Societies of Canada, with headquarters at Montreal. The Federation proposes "to work for the materialization of the ideals of the Zionist movement," and "to establish a publicly recognized and legally secured home for the Jewish people in Palestine."

London Extends Campaign

London's campaign to raise \$20,000 for the Y.M.C.A. Red Triangle Fund was continued to-day, the committee in charge having decided upon the extension with a view to giving many who have been overlooked the opportunity to assist the returning soldiers. It is known that the contributions to the fund are in excess of \$12,000. Final reports will be submitted to-night.

Dentist Found Dead in Bed

Dr. Wm. R. Nobbs, dentist, Mount Hamilton, was found dead in bed yesterday morning. Heart failure was the cause of his death.
