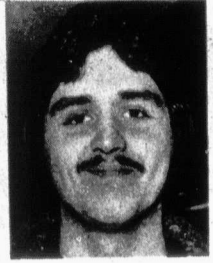
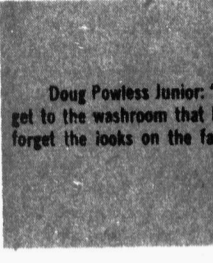


Embarrassing moments

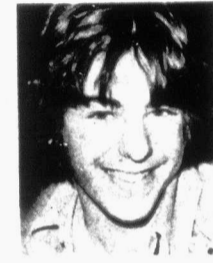
We've all had embarrassing moments we'd rather not remember. This week we stopped shoppers, asking them to share with us an experience when they felt they were not exactly at their best!



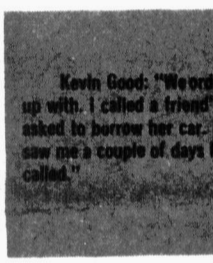
Brian Flebo: "Being caught on stairs with my girlfriend in... let's say a compromising position, when my parents came home. I was 17 at the time."
